I. Confirmation of minutes

[LC Paper No. CB(2)2744/05-06]

The minutes of the meeting held on 6 June 2006 were confirmed.

II. Meeting with the Administration

[Ref : HAD HQ IV 20/5/1, LC Paper Nos. CB(2)222/05-06(03), CB(2)342/05-06(01), CB(2)2368 /05-06(01) and CB(2)1049/05-06(01)]

- 2. The Bills Committee discussed issues relating to procurement of third party risks insurance in the paper entitled "The Administration's response to views of the professional bodies in the building management sector" [LC Paper No. CB(2)222/05-06(03)] and in the Administration's paper entitled "The Administration's response to the views of the deputations attending the meeting on 25 June 2005" [LC Paper No. CB(2)342/05-06(01)]. (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).
- 3. <u>The Chairman</u> and <u>Mr WONG Kwok-hing</u> were of the view that in order to afford better protection for third parties, the scope of the current proposal on procurement of third party risks insurance should be expanded as follows
 - (a) the policy on third party risks insurance to be procured by an owners' corporation (OC) should be required to cover liabilities incurred in relation to the unauthorised building works (UBWs), if any, of the building in respect of a third party's bodily injury and death; and

(b) for buildings which had only engaged the service of building managers but had not formed OCs, the building managers should be required on a compulsory basis to procure and keep in force in relation to the common parts of the building a policy of third party risks insurance.

<u>The Administration</u> agreed to consider whether there were any implementation difficulties if the scope of the current proposal on procurement of third party risks insurance would be expanded as suggested in paragraph 3(b) above.

- 4. <u>The Chairman</u> also suggested that the Administration should bring to the attention of those OCs which had accumulated a relatively large money reserve the benefits of procuring the professional indemnity and fidelity insurance policy on performance failure.
- 5. The Administration was requested to confirm whether a visitor or his/her dependant(s) could claim compensation in case of death or bodily injury under motor vehicle third party risks insurance if he was knocked down by a car in the carpark of a building and whether a claim could be made against the OC concerned as well.
- 6. Referring to the suggestion made by the Hong Kong Federation of Insurers that an Asbestos exclusion should be included in proposed section 3(2) of the draft Building Management (Third Party Risks Insurance) Regulation, some members were of the view that as the risk of the presence of asbestos was high only in very old buildings and providers for insurance which covered liabilities in respect of bodily injury and death arising from asbestos might be very limited in the market or confined to a few major insurers, the Administration should re-consider whether OCs should be allowed to procure, only on an optional basis, a policy on third party risks insurance which also covered liabilities in respect of bodily injury and death caused by or arising from asbestos. The Administration undertook to discuss with the Federation again.

7. Mr WONG Kwok-hing requested to put on record his view that a ceiling should be imposed on the third party liabilities borne by OCs in relation to the common parts of their buildings.
