#### I. Meeting with the Administration

(LC Paper Nos. CB(2)2185/04-05(01), CB(2)2248/04-05(01), (02) and (03), CB(2)2267/04-05(01) and CB(2)2292/04-05(01))

The Bills Committee deliberated (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).

- 2. The Bills Committee requested the Administration
  - (a) to consider the proposal of the Law Society of Hong Kong to extend the time limit within which the personal representative (PR) was required to apply for a grant of representation from 6 months to 12 months;
  - (b) to explain the changes in the application procedures for grant of representation, summary administration and sealing of a foreign grant after the abolition of estate duty;
  - (c) to provide the following statistics
    - (i) number of local deaths per year;
    - (ii) breakdown of applications for estate duty clearance by Statement in lieu of Affidavit (SILA) (i.e. for estate value below \$400,000) and non-SILA;
    - (iii) breakdown of finalised applications for estate duty clearance by SILA, non-SILA and non-dutiable, and non-SILA and dutiable;
    - (iv) number of applications for summary administration where the estate value was below \$150,000;
    - (v) breakdown of applications for grant of representation by estate value;
    - (vi) total number of applications for sealing of foreign grant;
  - (d) to consider the proposal to establish an appeal mechanism against the decision of SHA;
  - (e) to consider deleting the proposed section 60G;
  - (f) to consider the proposal to exempt PR dealing with small estates from intermeddling provisions;

#### Action

- (g) to include a warning clause in the form of Schedule of Assets and Liabilities and to consider the wording used to advise on the offence of intermeddling;
- (h) to advise on the practices in dealing with estate of deceased in overseas jurisdictions which did not impose estate duty, in particular the safeguards against intermeddling of estate; and
- (i) to respond to the concerns raised by the Law Society of Hong Kong regarding the arrangement for the inspection of and removal of items from a safe deposit box with joint renters.

(*Post-meeting note*: The Administration's response was issued to members vide LC Paper No. 2355/04-05(01) on 20 July 2005.)
