I. Clause-by-clause examination of the Bill

(The Bill, marked-up copy of the Bill, LC Paper Nos. CB(2)901/05-06(03), CB(2)1195/05-06(01), CB(2)1233/05-06(01) and CB(2)1259/05-06(01))

The Bills Committee deliberated (index of proceedings attached at Annex).

2. <u>The Bills Committee</u> noted that the Administration intended to obtain the World Health Organisation (WHO)'s views on the Administration's proposal to adopt the grandfathering and notation approach in allowing the use of a trade mark on the packet or retail container containing any of the prohibited words which implied that the cigarettes contained therein were less harmful to health than others.

The Administration agreed to provide the response from WHO when it became available.

3. As the majority of members were not in favour of allowing the use of a trade mark on the packet or retail container containing any of the prohibited words which implied that the cigarettes contained therein were less harmful to health than others, the Administration was requested to abort the proposal. Should the Administration decide to press ahead with the proposed amendment to clause 11, the Bills Committee would seek to restore the original provision. The Administration agreed to provide a written response on the request in two weeks' time.

4. The Administration was also requested to provide written responses to the following suggestions made by members at the meeting -

- (a) whether the proposed grandfathering provision could be made retrospective;
- (b) whether, and if so, which overseas common law jurisdiction(s) adopted the grandfathering and notation approach in allowing the use of a trade mark on the packet or retail container containing any of the prohibited words which implied that the cigarettes contained therein were less harmful to health than others;
- (c) to consider deleting the word "most" from new section 14(3)(b); and
- (d) to amend new section 14(6) to the effect that when prices of the tobacco product offered for sale in the premises were listed on a price board, the size of the price marker for each product should not be greater than 50 square centimetres and the price broad should not exceed 1 500 square centimetres.
