I. Meeting with the Administration

(LC Paper Nos. CB(2)2340/04-05(01) to (02) and CB(2)2657/04-05(01) to (03))

<u>The Bills Committee</u> deliberated (Index of proceedings at **Annex**).

- 2. The Administration was requested to provide a written response to the following questions raised by members at the meeting -
 - (a) what was the number of licensed hawker stalls not displaying tobacco

- advertisement, and the types of non-tobacco advertisement, if any, displayed by these hawker stalls; and
- (b) whether there were any labour disputes arising from enforcing the Smoking (Public Health) Ordinance since its implementation on 1 July 1999 by managers of statutory no smoking areas; if so, the number of cases occurred.
- 3. The Administration was also requested to provide the following information in writing -
 - (a) details on how it intended to help licensed hawker stalls to obtain nontobacco advertisement, in view of the revocation of the exemption of the display of tobacco advertisement at licensed hawker stalls proposed under the Bill; and
 - (b) public reaction and economic impact of the implementation of smoking ban in indoor workplaces and public places in California, State of New York, Ireland, Singapore and New Zealand.
- 4. At the request of the Bills Committee, <u>the Administration</u> agreed to provide information on the implementation of smoking ban in indoor workplaces and public places in Italy and Scotland.
- 5. <u>The Chairman</u> said that he would work out with the Clerk on a list of issues from the following documents for discussions by members in future meeting(s) -
 - (a) overseas experience on implementing smoking ban in indoor workplaces and public places provided by the Administration (LC Paper No. CB(2)2340/04-05(03));
 - (b) research report on smoke-free legislation in selected places prepared by the Research and Library of the Legislative Council Secretariat (RP10/04-05); and
 - (c) report of the overseas duty visit of the Panel on Health Services to study Thailand, Norway and Ireland's experience in implementing anti-smoking legislation (under preparation).

II. Arrangements of the meeting on 6 October 2005

6. To enable more time for deputations to give views on the Bill at the meeting on 6 October 2005, <u>members</u> agreed to change the maximum speaking time of each deputation from three minutes to five minutes. As a result of the aforesaid change, a number of deputations would be re-scheduled to give their views on the Bill on another date to be advised by the Secretariat after the meeting.
