SMOKING IN BARS AND RESTAURANTS IN HONG KONG

The soon to be introduced smoking bans will be a welcome change to most restaurants and bars in HK.

Smokers will have the option of going outside. In Hong Kong, the weather is fine most of the year. Smokers will be able to socialize outside and enjoy themselves just as much as if they were smoking inside.

Katrina believes that the new non-smoking rules should be bought in at the same time for all outlets in Hong Kong, to be fair to everyone.
