 - (a) provide before 7 March 2006 a written response to members' request that as a means to gain acceptance by the local community of the Kwai Tsing district, the Administration should consider providing facilities for the betterment of the district;
 - (b) include the response in (a) above in the speech to be delivered by the Secretary for the Environment, Transport and Works during the resumption of the Second Reading debate on the Bill; and
 - (c) continue to explore advanced technologies for the treatment of waste and report progress to the Panel on Environmental Affairs in due course.

(*Post-meeting note*: The Administration's responses on (a) above were issued to members vide LC Paper Nos. CB(2)1337/05-06(01), CB(2)1542/05-06(01) and CB(2)1561/05-06(01) on 8, 27 and 28 March 2006 respectively.)

 - (a) insert a footnote in the loose-leaf edition of the Laws of Hong Kong in relation to Schedule 9 to the effect that the formulation used in that Schedule (i.e. the states expressly named as read with the catch-all phrase of "any other state, or party to the Basel Convention ... " in the CSA to Schedule 9) represented all the states or parties included in Annex VII of the Basel Convention; and
