## <u>Information requested by Members at the Establishment Subcommittee</u> meeting held on 17 November 2004

The following were the no. of EPD prosecution cases in the last 3 years:

Year	No. of Cases	Plead Not Guilty (PNG) Cases	PNG Cases Taken Over by D of J

These cases were related to the seven environmental ordinances enforced by EPD. The seven ordinances are the Air Pollution Control Ordinance (APCO), the Noise Control Ordinance (NCO), the Waste Disposal Ordinance (WDO), the Water Pollution Control Ordinance (WPCO), the Environmental Impact Assessment Ordinance (EIAO), the Dumping at Sea Ordinance (DASO), and the Ozone Layer Protection Ordinance (OLPO). Involved sectors include factories, construction sites, livestock farmers, restaurants, property management companies, garages and waste traders.

Similar to quite a number of other government departments with prosecution functions, EPD staff are empowered to handle criminal prosecutions, from laying summons to taking plea, etc. As can be seen from the figures above, in most cases the defendants plead guilty. For the plead-not-guilty cases, the Central Prosecution Unit (CPU) of EPD would evaluate the situation, and decide whether to continue to conduct the trial cases. Generally, simple cases and those involving technical issues would be handled by CPU lay prosecutors. Should the case involve complicated issues, in particular on points of law, CPU would request D of J to take over. If D of J considers the request justified, they would take over the case for EPD, which in general would be conducted by appointing a counsel on fiat. CPU staff would then provide the necessary support to the appointed counsel accordingly. CPU also refers to D of J for legal advice, magistrate reviews, appeals, and other legal matters for the department.

There are currently eight staff in CPU, who are responsible for all prosecution matters in EPD. Six of them are in the Environmental Protection Officer grade and the remaining two in the Environmental Protection Inspector grade. CPU is headed by a Senior Environmental Protection Officer, and advised by a well qualified barrister, who is a non-civil service contract staff. Please see the attached Appendix that provides information on the qualification and experience of staff in the CPU.
