## I. Draft report on "Development of social enterprise"

[LC Paper No. CB(2)941/07-08(01)]

The Subcommittee deliberated (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).

2. <u>The Chairman</u> said that the Legislative Council (LegCo) Secretariat had prepared a draft report on "Development of social enterprise (SE)". He took members through Chapters 1 to 3 of the draft report and invited members' views on these Chapters. <u>Members</u> raised no questions on Chapter 1. Members' views on Chapters 2 (Present situation of SEs) and 3 (Problems faced by the SE sector) are summarised below.

#### Chapter 2

- 3. Referring to paragraphs 2.1 and 2.2 of the draft report, Ms LI Fung-ying took the view that SE involved business with the ultimate mission of achieving social objectives. SE's aim was not to maximize profit, but to generate revenue in support of the social mission. Given that there was no common definition of SE in Hong Kong, Ms LI considered that the Subcommittee should highlight its understanding of SE in the report, i.e. the pursuit of social objectives was more important than business objectives. Mr Ronny TONG, Mrs Anson CHAN, Dr Fernando CHEUNG and Mr Albert HO expressed similar views.
- 4. <u>Ms LI Fung-ying</u> suggested and <u>members</u> agreed that self-help groups and mutual-help groups should be included as examples of co-operative type SE in paragraph 2.4 (b) of the draft report.

#### Chapter 3

- 5. Pointing out that the Government had failed to come up with a concrete action plan for SE development in Hong Kong, Ms LI Fung-ying, Mr Ronny TONG, Ms Margaret NG, Mr LEUNG Kwok-hung and Mrs Anson CHAN held the view that the lack of Government's role and commitment in promoting SE development was one of the major problems faced by the SE sector. This should be reflected in Chapter 3 of the draft report.
- 6. <u>The Chairman</u> said that the LegCo Secretariat would incorporate members' views and revise the draft report accordingly.

#### Meeting with the business sector

7. <u>Mr James TIEN</u> said that as SE would operate with a commercial approach, it would be useful for the Subcommittee to discuss with the business sector the recommendations in the draft report with a view to putting forward some feasible

recommendations for the Administration's consideration and response. He suggested that a meeting with representatives from the business sector, who possessed relevant experience or were interested in SE development, should be arranged. Subject to members' views, he would approach the business sector and draw up a list of invitees for the Subcommittee's consideration.

LegCo Secretariat 8. <u>Members</u> expressed support for Mr James TIEN's suggestion. <u>Mrs Anson CHAN</u> said that she would meet with some entrepreneurs shortly, and would invite suggestions from them, if any, for members' consideration. <u>Mrs Selina CHOW</u> added that the Hong Kong Council of Social Service (HKCSS) should be invited to advise on the business organizations (including small and medium-sized enterprises) and non-governmental organizations which had participated actively in SE development in Hong Kong.

LegCo Secretariat

- 9. <u>Dr Fernando CHEUNG</u> said that HKCSS had compiled some reference materials on SEs in Hong Kong, such as a SE Directory. To facilitate members' future discussion, <u>Dr Fernando CHEUNG</u> suggested that the LegCo Secretariat should contact HKCSS for copies of the SE Directory for members' reference.
- 10. <u>Members</u> agreed that the Subcommittee would continue discussion on the draft report after meeting with the business sector.
- 11. <u>The Chairman</u> said that the date of next meeting would be fixed after the list of invitees had been drawn up. Members would be notified of the meeting date in due course.

#### II. Any other business

12. There being no other business, the meeting ended at 3:25 pm.
