### I. Draft report on "Development of social enterprise"

[LC Paper No. CB(2)941/07-08(01)]

The Subcommittee deliberated (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).

- 2. <u>The Chairman</u> said that the Subcommittee would continue discussion on the draft report on "Development of social enterprise (SE)". He then invited members' views on Chapter 3 (Problems faced by the social enterprise sector) of the draft report. The major views of members are summarized below
  - (a) small and medium enterprises (SMEs) were worried about unfair competition with SEs if too much Government support was provided for SEs to run business on a commercial basis. To encourage SEs to become financially self-sustainable in the long term, Government support for SEs should be time specific, say, three to five years;
  - (b) to allay the concern of SMEs, the Administration should enhance the public understanding of SE;
  - (c) the Administration should have a clear and well defined policy on SE. It should provide a clear definition of SE which spelt out the social objectives and scope of business of SEs, and establish a legal framework for SEs:
  - (d) to promote business support for SE development, the Administration should, as the first step, be tasked to encourage large commercial corporations to take part actively in running SE-related business; and
  - (e) the Administration should also conduct an overhaul of the administrative and policy barriers which would hinder SE development in Hong Kong.

#### Meeting with the social enterprise sector

3. <u>Mr James TIEN and Mrs Anson CHAN</u> advised that they had separately approached some entrepreneurs and the top management of a few large commercial corporations and invited them to give views on the subject of promoting social enterprise development in Hong Kong. Their general response was that they were not well versed with the subject. To enable the Subcommittee to draw up some practical recommendations for the Administration's consideration, <u>Mr James TIEN</u> suggested that the Subcommittee should consider gauging views from local social enterprise operators on the

problems faced by the sector and the measures to be taken to address the problems.

4. <u>Members</u> agreed that the Subcommittee would hold a meeting in late April 2008 to receive views from representatives of the social enterprise sector on the promotion of social enterprise development in Hong Kong. The Subcommittee would meet with representatives of the sector before proceeding to further discuss the draft report. <u>Members</u> agreed with the list of organizations to be invited. <u>The Chairman</u> added that members who would like to invite other organizations should inform the Legislative Council Secretariat within one week after the meeting. <u>Members</u> further agreed that to facilitate exchange of views on the subject, the next meeting would not be held in public.
