Education of children in special schools Information Note

Purpose

This paper provides additional information on the education of children in special schools, in response to Members' requests at the Sub-committee meeting on 30 March 2005.

Placement of students with special educational needs (SEN)

2. Students with SEN are placed in special schools based on the diagnosis/assessment findings and recommendations of relevant professionals, including doctors, psychologists, audiologists and education professionals, and in the light of parental choice. To ensure sufficient provision of special school places, we regularly review the demand and supply situation and adjust the approved capacity accordingly. The physical capacity, approved capacity and enrolment of different categories of special schools over the past three school years are at Appendix 1.

Provisions for special schools

- 3. Special schools are provided with 1.5 teachers per class. In addition, they enjoy additional support from a range of additional teachers and specialist staff. These provisions enable more flexible learning and teaching activities, such as group teaching and individual education programmes. In the 2004/05 school year, the teacher-to-student ratios for different categories of special schools range from 1:4.4 to 1:8.5. Details are at Appendix 2.
- 4. Similar to the mainstream schools, special schools can also apply to the Quality Education Fund and other charitable funds to finance projects in accordance with their educational pursuits. A list of some charitable funds available to the special education sector—for application is at Appendix 3.

Post-school placement of special school leavers

5. Based on information provided by special schools, the post-school placement of special school leavers for the past three years are at Appendix 4.

Such staff may include special school social worker, speech therapist, physiotherapist, occupational therapist, educational psychologist, braillist, school nurse, and occupational therapy assistant. In the 2004/05 school year, a total of about 450 specialist staff has been provided to special schools.
