Subcommittee to Study Issues Relating to the Provision of Boarding Places, Senior Secondary Education and Employment Opportunities for Children with Special Education Needs

Thank you for your letters of 28 February and 31 May regarding the provision of residential respite service for persons with disabilities aged under 15.

The Education and Manpower Bureau has been involved in the discussion on this matter because some of the special schools under it provides boarding service to cater for the long-term boarding needs of their students and to facilitate them to receive school education during school days. However, the provision of residential respite service for persons with disabilities aged under 15 is to meet the need of their parents and/or carers. The orientation of this service is different and should not come from the education system. It is by nature a social service.

The Secretary for Health, Welfare and Food will examine whether it is possible to enhance or extend the existing services to help fill this service gap with the existing resources allocated to him. He would also explore different service options and the merits of fee charging. He would revert to your Subcommittee in due course.
