# Implementation of the Mandatory Provident Fund System Progress report as at the end of July 2005

### **Purpose**

This paper updates Members on the latest progress of implementing the Mandatory Provident Fund (MPF) System.

#### **Enrolment**

2. The enrolment position as at the end of July 2005 is as follows:

3. The enrolment rates of employers and SEPs remained stable. The number of enrolled employees increased by 4 200, resulting in an increase of 0.3% in employees' enrolment rate. As at the end of July 2005, 14 200 employers, 255 600 employees and 22 000 SEPs were registered under the Industry Schemes<sup>1</sup>.

# **Complaint Handling**

Complaints received by the MPFA

4. Of the total 694 complaints received by the Mandatory Provident Fund Schemes Authority (MPFA) in July 2005, 98% concerned scheme members and 505 employers were involved. The breakdown is as follows:

Double registration with the two Industry Schemes trustees has been eliminated.

### Complaints received by the Labour Department (LD)

- 5. In July 2005, the LD received 12 MPF-related complaints, all of which were related to alleged wrongful deduction of wages.
- 6. Of a total of 112 complaints received from 1 January 2005 to the end of July 2005:
  - 47 cases were resolved after conciliation or advice given;
  - 35 cases were referred to the Labour Tribunal/Minor Employment Claims Adjudication Board for adjudication;
  - 11 cases where the employers were insolvent were referred to the Legal Aid Department, the Official Receiver's Office and the Protection of Wages on Insolvency Fund; and
  - 19 cases where the employees had lodged claims with the LD were awaiting conciliation result.

#### **Enforcement**

7. The MPFA continued to enforce the MPF Schemes Ordinance by proactive inspections of employment premises, investigation of complaints, making claims at law courts on behalf of employees to recover the outstanding default contributions, and prosecuting offending employers.

## **Education and Publicity**

- 9. During the month under review, information on the MPF System and investment was disseminated to the public through the mass media and talks.
- 10. On the media front, a two-part MPF programme was broadcast on RTHK's Putonghua Channel, targeting new arrivals from the Mainland. The programme covered information on the MPF System and MPF investment.

- 11. On the other hand, more than 20 articles were published in newspapers and magazines in July 2005. The articles covered a variety of topics including statutory obligations of MPF trustees, MPF investment, member protection, and fees and charges of MPF funds. Moreover, 13 press releases on enforcement action were issued.
- 12. Youth and community outreach activities continued, with talks organized for secondary schools and professional groups.
