1. Employment of non-civil service contract staff

The Administration proposes to brief the Panel on the updated position on the employment of non-civil service contract staff.

2. Promotion of integrity in the civil service

The Administration proposes to present to the Panel the work of the Civil Service Bureau in the promotion of integrity in the civil service.

3. Staff consultation mechanism in the civil service

At the Panel meeting held on 12 October 2004, Hon LEE Cheuk-yan suggested that the Administration be invited to discuss with the Panel on the subject of collective bargaining system for civil servants. Mr LEE then wrote to the Clerk to Panel on 3 November 2004, requesting that the Administration be invited to discuss with the Panel on the four recommendations made by the Committee on Freedom of Association of the International Labour Organization.

The Administration proposes to brief the Panel on the staff consultation mechanism at various levels within the civil service and the Administration's response to the related issues raised by Hon LEE Cheuk-yan.
