In relation to the third phase review on job-related allowances payable to civilian grades, Hon WONG Kwok-hing has written to the Chairman of the Panel on 2 November 2004 expressing his concerns about the impact of changes in the payment of Hardship Allowance on staff of the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department. He suggests that the subject be discussed at a Panel meeting and representatives of the relevant staff unions be invited to present their views at the meeting.

In response to the Panel's request to advance the date for reporting on the outcome of the review, the Administration confirmed on 8 December 2004 that it would report the outcome of the review to the Panel Pending the outcome of the review, the in March 2005. Administration was invited to attend the Panel meeting on 21 December 2004 to discuss the policy post-retirement employment by civil servants in relation to public concerns about the approval given by the Administration for the former Deputy Director of Housing to take up post-retirement employment with the Hong Kong Ferry (Holdings) Co. Ltd..
