Proposed Revision to Transport-related Fees and Charges

Purpose

This paper seeks Members' views on the proposed revision to the fees and charges of 22 transport related services that do not directly affect people's livelihood or general business activities.

Background

- 2. In line with the "user-pays" principle, it is Government's policy that fees and charges should in general be set at a level sufficient to cover the full cost of providing the services. Among the transport-related fees and charges now proposed for revision, some were last revised in 2000-2001.
- 3. In the 2004-05 Budget Speech, the Financial Secretary indicated the need to resume the revision of Government fees and charges, starting with those that do not directly affect people's livelihood or general business activities. A costing exercise has been carried out to review the costs of providing 22 transport related services.

Proposal

4. Based on the outcome of the costing review, we propose to adjust the fees and charges of 22 transport related services being provided by the Transport Department, Highways Department and Hong Kong Police Force. 5 fees are proposed to be increased and 17 decreased to full cost level. The proposed adjustments range from –61% to +20%. Details are set out at **Annex**.

- 5. Fee reductions would be implemented at one go, while fee increases would be implemented in a phased manner based on the following principles set by the Financial Services and Treasury Bureau—
 - (a) to achieve full-cost recovery within seven years for fees with the existing cost recovery rate of less than 40% through an annual increase of 20%;
 - (b) to achieve full-cost recovery within seven years for fees with the existing cost recovery rate between 40% to 70% through an annual increase of 15%; and
 - (c) to achieve full-cost recovery within one to three years for fees with the existing cost recovery rate of over 70% through an annual increase of 10%.

Efficiency Initiatives

6. The three departments regularly review and streamline the relevant work procedures and implement efficiency initiatives to reduce or contain costs in providing the services. Such efficiency savings have been reflected in the proposed fee adjustments.

Financial Implications

7. The proposed fee adjustments will result in a net reduction of around \$0.96 million in Government revenue in the first year of implementation.

Implementation Timetable

8. We plan to implement the fee adjustments to those items which do not require legislative amendments in the third quarter of 2005. Those requiring amendments to the relevant legislation will be implemented in the first quarter of 2006.

Advice Sought

9. Members' views are sought on the proposed adjustments to the fees and charges set out in **Annex**.
