I. Election of Chairman and Deputy Chairman

Mr James TIEN invited nominations for the chairmanship of the Panel for the 2004-2005 session in accordance with the election procedures set out in Appendix IV of the House Rules.

Election of Chairman

- 2. <u>Mr TAM Yiu-chung</u> nominated Miss CHAN Yuen-han and Mrs Sophie LEUNG, Dr YEUNG Sum and Mr Albert Jinghan CHENG seconded the nomination. <u>Miss CHAN</u> accepted the nomination. There being no other nominations, <u>Mr TIEN</u> declared Miss CHAN elected as Chairman of the Panel.
- 3. <u>The Chairman</u> took the chair and called for nominations for the deputy chairmanship of the Panel.

Election of Deputy Chairman

4. <u>Dr YEUNG Sum</u> nominated Dr Fernando CHEUNG and Mr Albert CHENG seconded the nomination. <u>Dr CHEUNG</u> accepted the nomination. As there were no other nominations, <u>the Chairman</u> declared Dr CHEUNG elected as Deputy Chairman of the Panel.

II. Schedule of meetings for the 2004-2005 session

5. <u>Members</u> agreed to hold regular meetings on the second Monday of each month at 10:45 am. As the meeting on 11 April 2005 coincided with the special Finance Committee meeting, <u>members</u> agreed to tentatively hold the April meeting on 20 April 2005 at 8:30 am.

III. Discussion items for next meeting

6. <u>Members</u> agreed to hold the next regular meeting on 8 November 2004 to discuss the following items -

- (a) briefing by the Secretary for Health, Welfare and Food;
- (b) Review of the Comprehensive Social Security Assistance (CSSA) Scheme, including arrangement of other payments under CSSA such as rent allowance and grant for school-related expenses; and
- (c) update on strategy and measures to tackle family violence.
- 7. In respect of the item in paragraph 6(c) above, <u>members</u> agreed to invite deputations to express views on the subject at a later meeting.
- 8. <u>Members</u> agreed to include the following issues on the list of items for discussion by the Panel in future meetings -
 - (a) latest situation on the implementation of review of family services (proposed by Mr Albert CHAN);
 - (b) residence requirements for Old Age Allowance (proposed by Mr TAM Yiu-chung);
 - (c) workload of social workers (proposed by Mrs Sophie LEUNG);
 - (d) operation of the SARS Trust Fund (proposed by Ms LI Fung-ying);
 - (e) transforming home for the elderly into care and attention home (proposed by Dr Fernando CHEUNG);
 - (f) measures to address poverty (proposed by Mr Frederick FUNG); and
 - (g) funding for social service in the next financial year (proposed by Mr LEE Cheuk-yan).
- 9. <u>The Chairman</u> said that the Administration would be invited to indicate the timing for discussion of the items set out in paragraph 8 above and the other items set out in the list of issues for discussion by the Panel tabled at the meeting.

IV. Any other business

10. <u>Members</u> agreed to decide at the November meeting on the setting up of two subcommittees under the Panel to review the CSSA Scheme and to follow-up on the strategy and measures to tackle family violence respectively.

11. There being no other business, the meeting ended at 2:55 pm.
