Action

I Meeting with the Administration/the two railway corporations

(LC Paper No. CB(1)1646/06-07(01) - Administration's response to the

follow-up to Bills Committee meetings on clause-by-clause examination of the Bill (Second

LC Paper No. CB(1)1646/06-07(02) - The Administration's response to

<u>The Bills Committee</u> deliberated (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).

- 2. <u>The Chairman</u> drew members' attention that in response to members' request at previous meetings, the Legal Service Division had prepared a paper entitled "Application of Rule 57(4)(a) of the Rules of Procedure and matters relating to the long title of the Rail Merger Bill" (LC Paper No. LS71/06-07) which had been circulated to members vide CB(1)1652/06-07 on 17 May 2007.
- 3. <u>The Chairman</u> also reminded members that the two meetings scheduled for 21 May 2007 at 8:30 am and 5:30 pm should be devoted to discussion of Committee Stage amendments (CSAs) to be moved by individual members to the Bill. In this connection, <u>Mr Andrew CHENG</u> requested to put on record his grave dissatisfaction with the hasty manner in which the Bill had been examined and said that his proposed

Action

CSAs might not be ready for the meetings on 21 May 2007. He said that problems had been identified with some provisions of the Bill in the course of scrutiny, and it was necessary to adopt a prudent approach to ensure that important issues would not be overlooked.

Substantial breakdown of service

4. <u>Members</u> noted the Administration's reply that whether a service breakdown was "substantial" had to be decided according to the facts of each case and it was not appropriate to list out the consideration factors. <u>Ms Emily LAU</u> requested the Administration to set out its policy intent and factors to be taken into account when determining whether a particular incident would be construed as a substantial failure or substantial breakdown of service by the post-merger corporation (MergeCo) when the Rail Merger Bill resumed the Second Reading debate. The Administration pointed out that as explained in the response, it would be difficult and not appropriate to draw a line on what was "substantial".

Provision of toilets at railway stations

5. Members welcomed MTR Corporation Limited (MTRCL)'s decision to include the provision of toilet facilities within, or adjacent to, stations in the overall design parameters for all future new railway lines, subject to planning and regulatory approval and views of local residents on the location of external ventilation exhausts. However, they noted with concern that the review of the feasibility of installing public toilets for the existing MTR stations would only focus on the eight above-ground MTR They expressed disappointment that MTRCL had refused to railway stations. consider retrofitting toilets for underground stations. In response, MTRCL highlighted the technical difficulties for the provision of toilet facilities at existing underground stations, in particular, the location of overhead line wires on top of the running tracks with a lot of electrical installations at both platform ends had made it difficult to identify suitable locations for retrofitting public toilets at the concourse level of underground stations. The corporation would take steps to raise awareness of the availability of staff toilets for the needy and review the signage in stations which provided information to passengers on the availability of public toilets nearby. Chairman advised members that the Subcommittee on Matters Relating to Railways (the Subcommittee) would discuss the provision of lavatories in MTR stations at the next meeting scheduled for 16 July 2007.

The Motion

6. In view of members' deliberation and concerns on the provision of toilet facilities at railway stations, <u>Mr Andrew CHENG</u> moved the following motion which was seconded by Miss TAM Heung-man –

"That this Committee strongly urges the provision of public toilets within the areas of the stations for the convenience of the public."

7. <u>The Bills Committee</u> agreed to proceed with the motion. <u>Mrs Selina CHOW</u> proposed amendments to the motion as highlighted in bold type below

8. <u>Mr WONG Kwok-hing</u> proposed further amendments as highlighted in bold type below to the motion as amended by Mrs Selina CHOW

9. <u>Dr Fernando CHEUNG</u> proposed further amendments to the motion as amended by Mrs Selina CHOW and Mr WONG Kwok-hing as highlighted in bold type below

"This Committee strongly urges the Government to instruct the MTR Corporation Limited to expeditiously formulate a policy on the provision of public toilets at railway stations, and to provide public toilets within the areas of the stations for the convenience of the public, including separate toilets specially for persons with disabilities."

Action

10. <u>The Chairman</u> put Mr Andrew CHENG's motion as amended by Mrs Selina CHOW, Mr WONG Kwok-hing and Dr Fernando CHEUNG to vote. Except for the Chairman who did not exercise her voting right, of the members present, all voted for the motion. The Chairman declared that the motion was carried.

(*Post-meeting note*: The wording of the motion was circulated to members vide LC Paper No. CB(1)1668/06-07 on 21 May 2007.)

Exemption under the Public Health and Municipal Services Ordinance

11. <u>Members</u> noted that in respect of the Public Health and Municipal Services Ordinance (Cap. 132) (PHMSO), the scope of the existing exemptions granted under section 54(1) of the Mass Transit Railway Ordinance (Cap. 556) (MTRO) exempted MTRCL from the provisions relating to public toilets, whereas the Kowloon-Canton Railway Corporation Ordinance (Cap. 372) had not provided for similar exemption. To maintain the status quo, the Administration would introduce a CSA to the Bill to clearly stipulate that during the concession period, section 54(1) of MTRO (insofar as it relates to sections 3 and 4 of Schedule 2) did not apply in relation to any part of the franchise relating to the KCRC Railways. In response to Ir Dr Raymond HO's enquiry about how to determine whether a particular new railway project would be exempted from PHMSO, the Administration explained that a natural MTR-extension would be exempted whereas for those which were not natural MTR-extension, exemption would be granted for those new projects developed by MergeCo under the "ownership approach".

Employment of persons with disabilities (PwDs)

12. <u>Members</u> asked MTRCL to adopt the Government's guidelines for giving PwDs an appropriate degree of preference for appointment over other candidates in line with the Government's practice.

Follow-up actions

- 13. <u>The Administration</u> and <u>the two railway corporations</u> were requested to follow up on certain matters and provide information as detailed below
 - (a) MTRCL to take forward members' proposal with the MTRCL Board with a view to giving PwDs an appropriate degree of preference for appointment over other candidates after the rail merger;
 - (b) The Administration to follow up on the exceedance cases of noise emitted near the non-enclosed stations arising from both road traffic and railway operation in the Panel on Environmental Affairs;
 - (c) MTRCL to report to the Subcommittee on the progress of the following matters in six months' time:
 - (i) the provision of air cooling system and additional fans under station improvements works;

Action

- (ii) further measures to enhance in-train dissemination of information to passengers through various channels, including WiFi, 3G services and LED display panels inside the train compartments;
- (iii) advancement of the schedule to replace the maintenance machines/locomotives used for maintenance works of the KCR system by new and quieter models;
- (iv) measures to facilitate PwDs to use the KCRC bus service in the North-west Transit Service Area; and
- (v) progress of the publicity work, including placing directional signs, to raise the awareness of the availability of staff toilets for the needy and to inform the travelling public on the location of the public toilets near the stations.

II Any other business

14. There being no other business, the meeting ended at 1:08 pm.
