The Bills Committee deliberated (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).

- 2. The Bills Committee discussed the following proposals put forth by some members
 - (a) the requirement that the Chief Executive (CE) should not be a member of a political party under section 31 of the Chief Executive Election Ordinance should be abolished;

- (b) an upper limit should be imposed on the number of subscribers required for nominating candidates for the office of CE; and
- (c) the electorate base of the Election Committee should be expanded.
- 3. On proposal (a), Members belonging to the Liberal Party considered that an elected CE should have the discretion to maintain or relinquish his political affiliation. They had no strong view on proposal (b). On proposal (c), they considered that giving voting rights to not more than six directors from each corporation was an acceptable option to expand the electorate of the Election Committee.
- 4. Members belonging to the Democratic Alliance for the Betterment and Progress of Hong Kong did not support proposals (a) and (b). Members of the Democratic Party and some members expressed support for all three proposals.
- 5. The Bills Committee also discussed whether Committee Stage amendments (CSAs) could be moved to the Bill to give effect to these proposals, and noted the response of Senior Assistant Legal Adviser 2 that, subject to the actual wording of the proposed CSAs, the matters covered by proposals (a) and (c) did not appear to relate directly to any provision of the Bill. He reiterated that it was for the President of the Legislative Council to make a ruling on any proposed CSAs based on the principles set out in Rule 57(4) and 57(6) of the Rules of Procedure of the Legislative Council.
