I. Meeting with the Administration

2. The Bills Committee requested the Administration –

Definition of "copy"

(a) to consider amending sub-clause (a)(i) under the definition of "copy" in clause 2(1) of the Bill along the lines of "any copy, extract or summary of material which in substance is a copy, extract or summary of the material or identifies itself as such copy, extract or summary of such contents":

Definition of "covert surveillance"

- (b) to provide information on the methods used by law enforcement agencies, the devices used and the types of surveillance that would fall within the meaning of "covert surveillance";
- (c) to reconsider whether the scope of "covert surveillance" should be confined to those cases in which surveillance device was used;
- (d) to provide information on the law which governed covert surveillance by undercover agents without the use of surveillance device;
- (e) to explain why surveillance carried out by a participating party or undercover agent without the use of surveillance device was not covered under the Bill; and
- (f) to consider spelling out in the long title that the Bill sought to protect the freedom and privacy of communication of Hong Kong residents as provided in Article 30 of the Basic Law.
