I. Meeting with the Administration

The Bills Committee deliberated (index of proceedings attached at Annex).

2. The Bills Committee requested the Administration –

New clause 2(5A)

(a) to explain whether the threshold of "likely" in the proposed new clause 2(5A) was appropriate; and

Clause 3

- (b) to consider stating explicitly the necessity test in clause 3(1)(b).
- 3. The Administration advised that it was inappropriate to set out in the Bill that the Bill did not cover offences under Article 23 of the Basic Law (BL23) that had not yet been enacted. The Administration also advised that the Secretary for Security would state in his speech during the resumption of the Second Reading debate on the Bill that the public security ground would not be used for political purposes, nor for suppressing the right to freedom of expression or the right of peaceful assembly, and that the Bill was unrelated to the BL23 exercise.
