I. Election of Chairman

Mrs Selina CHOW was elected Chairman of the Bills Committee.

2. <u>The Chairman</u> declared interest as a member of the Hong Kong Jockey Club (HKJC). <u>Mr Abraham SHEK and Mr Tommy CHEUNG</u> also declared interest as voting members of HKJC.

II. Meeting with the Administration

- 3. <u>The Bills Committee</u> deliberated (Index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).
- 4. The Bills Committee requested the Administration to
 - (a) explain the basis for the estimated size of the illegal market in horse race amounting to \$50 to \$60 billion;
 - (b) provide update information on the total amount of cash and betting slips seized by the Police from illegal bookmakers on horse racing and an estimate on the number of illegal bookmakers;

- (c) provide the respective amounts of turnover and betting duty on horse race betting, football betting and lotteries in each of the years from 2003 to 2006;
- (d) provide the respective findings of the surveys commissioned by the Administration and conducted by the Hong Kong Polytechnic University and the University of Hong Kong concerning the gambling population, including the increase of adolescents in the gambling population after the authorisation of football betting;
- (e) provide information on the estimated amount of betting turnover of illegal gambling on horse racing from 1996-97 onwards, and elaborate on how the change in betting duty rates in the past had affected legal and illegal betting turnover on horse racing;
- (f) explain the measures taken or contemplated to combat illegal bookmaking activities;
- (g) assess the impact of the reformed betting duty system on HKJC staff; and
- (h) explain how the Administration could monitor HKJC on the provision of rebates to high-value bettors given that this was not provided in the Bill.

III. Date of next meeting

5. <u>Members</u> agreed to hold the next meeting on Thursday, 18 May 2006 at 8:30 am in the Chamber of the Legislative Council Building.

[Post-meeting Note: The meeting was subsequently rescheduled to be held immediately after the Chief Executive's Question and Answer Session scheduled for 3:00 pm on 18 May 2006.]

- 6. <u>Members</u> also agreed to invite views from deputations and individuals which/who had presented views to the Panel on Home Affairs concerning the proposed betting duty reforms. The meeting to receive deputations and individuals would be scheduled for Wednesday, 24 May 2006 at 8:30 am.
