 - (c) comment on the concern of some deputations that should the proposed reforms be implemented, the Hong Kong Jockey Club staff would be encouraged or even required to strengthen their efforts to promote horse race betting; and
 - (d) provide a consolidated reply to the views and concerns expressed by the deputations.
