The Administration informed Members that the Secretary for Health, Welfare and Food (SHWF) would undertake at the resumption of the Second Reading debate on the Bill that the Administration would review Cap 169 and related issues and report the outcome of the review to the relevant Panel in one year.

 - (c) provide a list of the provisions under the Regulations which provided for a continuing offence;

- (d) include the level of fine for a continuing offence in the upcoming review; and
- (e) enhance public education on the criminal offence of abandoning animals under the Rabies Ordinance and responsible animal guardianship in veterinary clinics.
