Mr LAU Kong-wah, Chairman of the Panel, said that the paper sought the permission of the House Committee under rule 22(u) of the House Rules for the Panel to visit Pearl River Delta on 5 and 6 December 2005 on the invitation of the Finance and Economy Committee of the People's Congress of Guangdong Province. Mr LAU further said that the purpose of the visit was to observe the latest developments in cross-boundary transport infrastructure and exchange views with the Mainland authorities on traffic and
