#### Action

I. Confirmation of the minutes of the 21st meeting held on 21 April 2006 (LC Paper No. CB(2) 1832/05-06)

The minutes were confirmed.

## II. Matters arising

Report by the Chairman on her meeting with the Chief Secretary for Administration

2. <u>The Chairman</u> said that there was nothing special to report.

### III. Business arising from previous Council meetings

- (a) Legal Service Division reports on bills referred to the House Committee in accordance with Rule 54(4)
  - (i) Betting Duty (Amendment) Bill 2006 (LC Paper No. LS 58/05-06)
- 3. <u>The Chairman</u> said that the purpose of the Bill was to reform the betting duty system for betting on horse races, and to rationalise the regulatory regime for the conduct of betting on horse races. The Panel on Home Affairs had discussed the proposed reforms at its meetings on 13 May and 16 June 2005. Members had raised various concerns about the proposed reforms.
- 4. <u>The Acting Legal Adviser</u> said that the Legal Service Division was still scrutinising the content of the Bill.
- 5. <u>The Chairman</u> proposed that a Bills Committee be formed to study the Bill in detail. <u>Members</u> agreed. The following Members agreed to join: Mrs Selina CHOW, Mr SIN Chung-kai (as advised by Dr YEUNG Sum),

Miss CHOY So-yuk, Mr Andrew CHENG, Mr Abraham SHEK, Mr Tommy CHEUNG, Mr Albert CHAN, Mr LAM Wai-keung, Mr Jeffrey LAM, Dr Fernando CHEUNG, Mr CHIM Pui-chung, Dr Patrick LAU, Mr Albert CHENG and Miss TAM Heung-man.

# (ii) Freight Containers (Safety) (Amendment) Bill 2006 (LC Paper No. LS 55/05-06)

- 6. <u>The Chairman</u> said that the purpose of the Bill was to implement the International Convention for Safe Containers in Hong Kong to enhance safety in the handling and transportation of containers. The Panel on Economic Services had been consulted on the proposed amendments at its meeting on 27 February 2006. The Panel generally supported the proposed amendments.
- 7. <u>The Chairman</u> added that the Legal Service Division was seeking clarification from the Administration on certain technical issues.
- 8. <u>The Chairman</u> proposed that a decision on the Bill be deferred pending the Division's further report. <u>Members</u> agreed.

## (iii) Revenue Bill 2006 (LC Paper No. LS 57/05-06)

- 9. <u>The Chairman</u> said that the purpose of the Bill was to give effect to the salaries tax proposals announced by the Financial Secretary in his 2006-07 Budget Speech. The policy aspects of the Bill had not been referred to any Panel for discussion.
- 10. <u>The Acting Legal Adviser</u> said that no difficulties in relation to the legal and drafting aspects of the Bill had been identified.
- 11. <u>Members</u> did not raise objection to the resumption of the Second Reading debate on the Bill.
- (b) Legal Service Division report on subsidiary legislation gazetted on 21 April 2006 and tabled in Council on 26 April 2006
  (LC Paper No. LS 60/05-06)
- 12. The Chairman said that only one item of subsidiary legislation, i.e. the Employees Retraining Ordinance (Amendment of Schedule 2) Notice 2006, was gazetted on 21 April 2006 and tabled in Council on 26 April 2006. The Notice amended the list of training bodies which could conduct training courses for the purposes of the Ordinance.

- 13. <u>Members</u> did not raise any queries on this item of subsidiary legislation.
- 14. <u>The Chairman</u> reminded Members that the deadline for amending this item of subsidiary legislation was 24 May 2006, or 14 June 2006 if extended by resolution.
