I. Election of Chairman and Deputy Chairman

Election of Chairman

Mr James TIEN, Member of the highest precedence in the Subcommittee, presided over the election of the Chairman of the Subcommittee. Mr TIEN called for nominations for chairmanship of the Subcommittee. Ms Emily LAU was nominated by Dr YEUNG Sum and the nomination was seconded by Mr LEE Wing-tat. Ms LAU accepted the nomination. Mr TIEN called for other nominations.

- 2. Mr TAM Yiu-chung was nominated by Mr LAU Kong-wah and the nomination was seconded by Mr Howard YOUNG. Mr TAM accepted the nomination. Mr TIEN called for other nominations. There was no other nomination. Ms Emily LAU suggested that a forum for presentation of platform by the candidates be held. Members agreed.
- 3. <u>Ms Emily LAU</u> said that if she became Chairman of the Subcommittee, she would ensure that members and the public were given ample opportunities to discuss the methods for selecting the Chief Executive in 2007 and for forming the Legislative Council (LegCo) in 2008 (the "electoral methods"), notwithstanding the Administration's indication that the deadline for endorsement of the proposals for the "electoral methods" by the LegCo was December 2005.
- 4. <u>Mr TAM Yiu-chung</u> said that he would, if elected, make appropriate arrangements, in accordance with the Rules of Procedure of LegCo, to enable Subcommittee members and the public to have a thorough discussion on this important issue.
- 5. As members did not raise any question with the candidates, <u>Mr TIEN</u> announced a vote by secret ballot. After all the members had cast their votes, <u>Mr TIEN</u> invited Dr YEUNG Sum and Mr LAU Kong-wah, who had nominated the two candidates respectively, to monitor the counting of votes.
- 6. <u>Mr TIEN</u> announced that 14 and 29 members had voted for Ms Emily LAU and Mr TAM Yiu-chung respectively, and declared Mr TAM elected as the Chairman of the Subcommittee.

Election of Deputy Chairman

7. <u>The Chairman</u> took the chair and called for nominations for the deputy chairmanship of the Subcommittee. Ms Emily LAU was nominated by Dr YEUNG Sum and the nomination was seconded by Mr LEE Wing-tat. <u>Ms LAU</u> accepted the nomination. <u>The Chairman</u> called for other nominations.

- 8. Mr Howard YOUNG was nominated by Mr Jeffrey LAM and the nomination was seconded by Mr CHAN Kam-lam. Mr YOUNG accepted the nomination. There was no other nomination.
- 9. <u>Mr Howard YOUNG</u> said that if he was elected, he would ensure that members and the public would be given ample time to discuss the proposals for the "electoral methods". As members did not raise any question with the candidates, <u>the Chairman</u> announced a vote by secret ballot. After all the members had cast their votes, <u>the Chairman</u> invited Dr YEUNG Sum and Mr Jeffrey LAM, who had nominated the two candidates respectively, to monitor the counting of votes.
- 10. <u>The Chairman</u> announced that 16 and 26 members had voted for Ms Emily LAU and Mr Howard YOUNG respectively, and declared Mr YOUNG elected as the Deputy Chairman of the Subcommittee.

II. Any other business

Application for late membership

11. <u>The Chairman</u> said that in accordance with Rule 23(b) of the House Rules, he would accept the application for late membership of Mr David LI, who was absent from Hong Kong during the time when a Member should signify his membership. Mr LI's application was tabled at the meeting

Proposed meeting dates for November 2005

12. The Chairman drew members' attentions to the list of proposed meeting dates in November 2005 tabled at the meeting. Members agreed to the dates, except 12 and 19 November 2005 (Saturday mornings for the purpose of receiving deputations) which, according to Ms Margaret NG, were reserved by the Subcommittee on West Kowloon Cultural District Development (WKCD). Members agreed that the two meetings for receiving deputations would be rescheduled to be held in the afternoon on the same day, if necessary, to avoid to a clash with the Subcommittee on WKCD.

(*Post-meeting note*: The two meetings reserved for receiving deputations have been rescheduled for the afternoon of Saturdays, 12 and 19 November 2005. A meeting schedule was issued to members vide LC Paper No. CB(2)208/05-06 on 28 October 2005.)

13. <u>The Chairman</u> suggested that in line with the usual practice, advertisements would be placed in one English newspaper and one Chinese newspaper to invite the public to give views on the package of proposals for the "electoral methods". <u>Members</u> agreed.

- 14. <u>Members</u> noted that the next meeting would be held on 4 November 2005 at 8:30 am. <u>Dr YEUNG Sum</u> said that the Chief Secretary for Administration should be invited to attend the meeting. <u>Mr Martin LEE</u> said that the Administration should be requested to provide a timetable for implementation of the proposals set out in the Fifth Report of the Constitutional Development Task Force for members' reference at the next meeting.
