I. Election of Chairman

Mr LEE Cheuk-yan was elected Chairman of the Subcommittee.

II. Meeting with the Administration

[LC Paper Nos. CB(2)2240/05-06(01) - (03)]

- 2. The Subcommittee deliberated (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).
- 3. <u>The Administration</u> briefed members on the Administration's proposal to implement the second phase of the Factories and Industrial Undertakings (Loadshifting Machinery) Regulation.
- 4. While members of the Subcommittee agreed to the policy of requiring operators of specified loadshifting machines to receive training for the safe operation of such machines, some members expressed concern about the high course fees and the lack of monitoring mechanism over the setting and adjustment of course fees by course providers.
- 5. The Subcommittee requested the Administration to provide
 - (a) estimated course fees charged by prospective course providers for each type of specified loadshifting machines under the second phase, together with the course duration and possible fee reduction for each course;
 - (b) gist of discussions of the meeting of the Advisory Committee on Certification of Operators of Specified Plants and Equipment to be held on 8 June 2006 in relation to the relaxation of the pre-requisite requirements for existing operators of specified loadshifting machines to attend refresher training;

- (c) response to some members' suggestion of providing loans or subsidy or fee waiver to existing and prospective operators who had difficulties in paying the course fees; and
- (d) timetable for conducting the feasibility study of introducing a smart card to replace the various certificates relating to industrial safety training.

- 6. Members agreed to hold the next meeting on 13 June 2006 at 4:30 pm.
- 7. To allow more time for the Subcommittee to study the subsidiary legislation, members agreed that the Chairman should move a motion to extend the scrutiny period to 12 July 2006.
