Action

I. Confirmation of minutes

[LC Paper No. CB(2)33/06-07]

The minutes of the meeting held on 26 September 2006 were confirmed.

II. Meeting with the Administration

[LC Paper Nos. CB(2)71/06-07(01) and CB(2)2878/05-06(02)]

- 2. The Subcommittee deliberated (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).
- 3. <u>The Administration</u> briefed the Subcommittee on its responses to members' concerns and suggestions raised at the last meeting, as detailed in the paper [LC Paper No. CB(2)71/06-07(01)]. In response to members' concern on the coverage of the definition of "meat" in section 3 of the Food Business Regulation, the Administration advised that the Director of Food and Environmental Hygiene was empowered under relevant provisions of the Regulation to issue licence/permit for the sale of other types of meat such as game or reptile for human consumption in Hong Kong.
- 4. <u>Members</u> expressed concern that the parallel use of "冷凍" and "冰鮮" as the Chinese rendition of "chilled" in the legislation and the licensing requirements and conditions for fresh provision shops (FPSs)/market stalls that were endorsed/permitted to sell chilled meat respectively might cause difficulties in prosecutions and the enforcement actions taken might be subject to legal challenge. They also considered that it would be misleading to the consumers. In order to dispel any confusion to the public and avoid any adverse impact on the trade, <u>members</u> suggested that the Administration should consider -
 - (a) adding ("冰鮮") after "冷凍" where the Chinese rendition "chilled" was

used in the licensing requirements and conditions for FPSs/market stalls that were endorsed/permitted to sell chilled meat, including in the notice put up by the FPS licensees/market tenants selling chilled beef, mutton or pork; and

(b) allowing for a grace period for the trade to comply with the revised requirements and conditions and subsidising the trade for any additional cost for the installation of new signs.

- 5. After consideration of members' concerns and suggestions, the Administration had undertaken that, unless there was strong objection from the trade, they would amend the licensing requirements and conditions for FPSs/market stalls that were endorsed/permitted to sell chilled meat so that both the term "冰鮮" and "冷凍" would be used for "chilled" upon renewal of existing licences or tenancies as well as granting of new licences and tenancies. If there was strong objection from the trade, the Administration would revert to the Panel on Food Safety and Environmental Hygiene.
- 6. Mr Alan LEONG remarked that while he would not raise further queries about the Administration's justification for not providing a definition of "chilled" in the legislation, he remained of the view that there might be difficulties in future prosecution actions if the word "chilled" was not clearly defined in the legislation.
- 7. Referring to a recent case where a tenant of a public market stall in Tsuen Wan contravened the Amendment Regulation by selling chilled pork as fresh pork, the Administration informed the Subcommittee that the relevant market tenancy had been terminated in two weeks' time after the contravention was detected. The Administration had explained that the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department could not terminate the tenancy of the market stall immediately as time was required for the necessary procedures and for the tenant to make representations against the decision of the Department. At members' suggestion, the Administration agreed to enhance their publicity effort on enforcement actions taken against the malpractice of selling chilled meat as fresh meat.

8. <u>The Chairman</u> concluded that the Subcommittee was in support of the Food Business (Amendment) Regulation 2006 and would not move any amendments to the Amendment Regulation. The Subcommittee would report to the House Committee on 20 October 2006.
