Supplementary Information on Indoor Air Quality EA Panel Meeting, 28 November 2005

Members requested at the captioned meeting for additional information on the target to be achieved by the Indoor Air Quality (IAQ) Certification Scheme and prosecutions under legislations relating to IAQ.

IAQ is a fairly new issue internationally. Our present policy objective is to promote the understanding of IAQ through publicity programmes and to encourage wider participation by the community in the IAQ Certification Scheme.

In 2006, we plan to organize three additional seminars and six roadshows to raise public awareness of IAQ. Our targets are to put the message across to over ten thousand people through the roadshows and introduce the IAQ certification scheme through the seminars to more than a thousand representatives from building management companies, building owners and relevant professional bodies. We expect to have about 110 premises certified under the Certification Scheme. In addition, we will enhance the services of the IAQ Information Centre and its cyber centre as the focal point in promoting IAQ to the public, and we expect that over 6,000 and 25,000 patrons will visit the Information Centre and the cyber centre in 2006 respectively.
