Notes: All the above mentioned contacts are for operation of restaurants, kiosks and pro-shops with different charging methods - monthly rental or a certain percentage of the gross receipts from the business. As some of the same types of service contracts awarded by the Administration do not have fixed contract values because of the varying charging mechanism, it is therefore very difficult to calculate the total value of the same type of service contracts awarded by the Administration.
