## **Hong Kong Aviation Club**

#### Submission to the Special Meeting of Panel on Planning, Lands and Works to be held on 25 January 2005

In response to the newly released concept plans on "Kai Tak Planning Review" by the Planning Department, we are writing to express our sincere concerns that the Government is intended to turn the existing site of our Kai Tak Club house to "Sung Wong Toi Park" in the 3 outline concept plans. From the report of the Stage 1 Public Participation of the Kai Tak Planning Review, it stated that one of its visions is to consider Kai Tak as one of the collective memories of Hong Kong in view of its aviation history. It also stressed that the relevant heritage elements should be reckoned in the new planning framework. We are disappointed that the Hong Kong Aviation Club, being the primitive inhabitant of Kai Tak, is being excluded from the Kai Tak Planning and not being recognized as part of the heritage elements.

The Hong Kong Aviation Club (HKAC) was formed in 1981 as a result of an amalgamation of the Hong Kong Flying Club and the Aero Club of Hong Kong, which had been operating flying activities at Kai Tak before the commercial airlines since 1920s'. HKAC is a non-profit making organization with tax exemption by the Inland Revenue Department and has been granted a short term lease at HK\$1 nominal rent by the Lands Department since January 2003. The main objectives of the HKAC can be categorized as follows:

#### **Community and Youth Development**

One of the primary focuses of our Club is the promotion of general aviation in the local community. HKAC launched a Young Eagles program in 1998 where members of the Club provide free air experiences to youth of the Hong Kong Air Cadets Corp (HKACC) and over 900 youth have been benefited from this program last year. In addition, we have offered charity flights to under-privileged children since 1980's. HKAC has a special concern for the Youth and has been active in arranging Club visits for primary and secondary students where we provide access to light aircraft and helicopters. The HKAC has provided a free venue to HKACC since 1986 and provided light aircraft access to HKACC for ground training. Light aircraft display has been provided by the Club to various organizations and locations, e.g. Air Scout of Wah Yan College and 3,000 students from mainland China for aviation education and exposure. In addition, HKAC has been proud to provide scholarships leading to Private Pilot License PPL since 1976. Most recent scholarship was awarded to a member of the HKACC.

#### **Aviation Sports Pursuit**

The HKAC is privileged to be the sole official Hong Kong representative to the Fédération Aéronautique Internationale (FAI). HKAC is recognized by the Sport Federation & Olympic Committee of Hong Kong, China as the local authority for issuing Aero Sporting Licenses for aviators in Hong Kong. Holders of the license are able to represent Hong Kong to attend all international FAI recognized aviations sports including parachuting, paragliding, air-modelling, aerobatic flying and hot air ballooning, etc. The spirit of Shenzhou VI gave us a brief, glittering glimpse of how far we can stretch in the aviation dream. The HKAC has been keen in providing flying opportunities for local Hong Kong citizens who have the passion to fly. As a continued effort on general aviation promotion, the Hong Kong Aviation Day was organized in 2002 at the Club and co-organize with HKACC in 2003.

Being the leader of all Hong Kong Aero Sports, the Club house at Sung Wong Toi Road provides administrational, recreational and educational facilities to:

- 1,500 members of the HKAC;
- Hong Kong Parachute Association;
- Guild of Air Pilots & Navigators, Hong Kong;
- Royal Aeronautical Society of Hong Kong;
- Hong Kong Balloon & Airship Club;
- Air Modeler enthusiastic
- Aviation Development Council
- Far East Flying & Technical School
- 4,000 members of HKACC and in particular 800 Adult Leaders.


#### **Flight Training**

HKAC manages the Far East Flying & Technical School Ltd. (FEFTS), a wholly owned subsidiary for aviation education. The FEFTS was previously the largest flying technical college in Asia, catering for some 500 students per annum in Kai Tak at its peak in the 1950's. Currently, FEFTS organizes Ground School Courses on Private Pilot License (PPL) curriculum to prepare students for Hong Kong Civil Aviation Department (CAD) written exams. HKAC is the only organization in Hong Kong that can provide CAD certified instructors and the majority of course participants are from the general public. As the only organization other than Airlines in Hong Kong that can provide flight training up to PPL level and Qualified Flying Instructor (QFI) according to CAD requirement in light aircraft and helicopter, our students have included officers of CAD which received PPL and recency training. Many graduates of our courses have been able to pursuit a career in the Airlines or related industries, such as aircraft maintenance, airport management, air traffic controllers, etc. HKAC take pride in providing aerobatic and emergency maneuver training to instructors of Civil Aviation Flight University of China in 2005.

HKAC has in its own name, and previously in the names of its predecessors held its current premises, originally under Government leases and now under a Short Term Tenancy since 1958. The continue availability of the site and the existing buildings is essential for both HKAC and the associated organizations listed above and indeed for the future of general aviation in Hong Kong.

In view of our community service objectives and to retain general aviation sport activities in Hong Kong, we sincerely request the Government could provide policy support for the HKAC to retain its current site at Sung Wong Toi Road, Kai Tak. Your consideration is very much appreciated.

### Detectives crack drug packaging operation

The operation was mounted after an 18-year-old youth was arrested in Causeway Bay alegedy having a packet of No 3 heroin in his possession.

When they searched the youth, believed to be linked to a major drug syndicate in Kowloon, delectives found a bunch of keys which led them to a flat in King Wah Road, believel to have been used as a drug backaging centre.

In the fla, detectives found a large quantity of packaging and weighing equipment together with 40 kilograms of No 3 he oin valued at \$2 million, believed to be for distribution to drug traffickers on Honglong Island.
