Proposed timing for discussion

1. Proposed merger of MTR and Kowloon-Canton Railway systems

22 and 23 May 2006

The Administration briefed members on the proposed way forward for the merger of MTR and KCR systems at a joint meeting of the Panel on Transport and the Panel on Financial Affairs held on 12 April 2006. The Panel subsequently followed up the staff-related issues arising from the rail merger at its meeting on 28 April 2006. As to the remaining issues arising from the rail merger, they will be dealt with at two further joint meetings with the Panel on Financial Affairs.

2. Alignment for North Lantau Highway Connection and update on Hong Kong - Zhuhai - Macao Bridge

2nd/3rd Quarter 2006

The Administration plans to brief the Panel on the outcome of the second round consultation on the North Lantau Highway Connection alignment options which is now in progress, and the progress update of the planning and implementation of Hong Kong – Zhuhai – Macao Bridge including the construction cost, financial arrangements, toll determination mechanism and traffic flow projections etc.

3. Legislative amendments relating to lighting, reflectors and markings of vehicles

2nd/3rd Quarter 2006

The Administration expects that the draft legislation will be ready by 3rd Quarter 2006. It will consult the Panel before the legislation is tabled at LegCo for negative vetting.

4. Road P1 advance works at Sunny Bay

To be confirmed

The Administration intends to consult the Panel before putting the funding proposal to the Public Works Subcommittee for consideration.

Proposed timing for discussion

5. Reconstruction and Improvement to Tuen Mun Road

To be confirmed

The Administration intends to take more time to discuss the way forward of the project with the Tuen Mun District Council, and will determine the exact timing for consulting the Panel in the light of the consultation process.

6. Northwest New Territories Traffic and Infrastructure Review

28 July 2006

The item was discussed on 22 April 2005. Members noted the merits of different packages of highway projects and urged the Administration for timely delivery of the highway projects.

7. Employment arrangements for franchise bus drivers and safety of bus operation

To be confirmed

This item is proposed by Mr WONG Kwok-hing. In recent years, with the Kowloon Motor Bus Company (1933) Limited taking the lead, some franchised bus operators have changed the employment terms for their bus drivers to contract terms and in some cases, the contract period only lasts for one year. Further employment of bus drivers upon expiry of their employment contracts is subject to review, resulting in a lack of job security for bus drivers. Mr WONG is concerned that the new employment arrangements would pose immense psychological pressure on bus drivers, which in turn would directly affect the safety of franchised bus operation.

8. Exemption from regulation 53(2) of the Road Traffic (Traffic Control) Regulations (Cap. 374 sub. leg. G) for vehicles used for canvassing activities

To be confirmed

At the Subcommittee to Study Four Items of Subsidiary Legislation under the Road Traffic Ordinance, some members of the Subcommittee considered that the Administration should take a broader view and the proposed Amendment Regulations should aim at facilitating not only the float parades to be held at the Hong Kong Disneyland but also canvassing activities during elections. The Administration was of the view that the safety requirements for standing passengers on such vehicles went beyond the ambit of the then legislative amendments, but the Administration undertook to separately examine this proposal in detail.

Proposed timing for discussion

9. Review of legislation governing failure to comply with traffic signals

Outside 2005-06 legislative session

At the Subcommittee on Proposed Resolutions under the Road Traffic (Driving-offence Points) Ordinance (Cap. 375) and the Fixed Penalty (Criminal Proceedings) Ordinance (Cap. 240), some members suggested and the Administration agreed to review the relevant legislation governing failure to comply with traffic signals after the new penalties had been effected. The Administration aims to complete the review by the end of 2006.

10. Measures to enhance safety of public light bus operations

23 June 2006

The item was discussed by the Panel on 19 December 2005. The Panel will revisit the subject in June 2006 and the Administration has been requested to speed up the related work, and reported to the Panel progress of the various initiatives to enhance safety of PLB operations.

11. Measures to rationalize utilization of Build-Operate-Transfer tunnels

To be confirmed

The item was discussed by the Panel on 19 December 2005. The Panel urged the Administration to speed up the work to improve the distribution of traffic among the three road harbour crossings and enhance the utilization of Route 3, including the discussions with the operators of the Eastern Harbour Crossing, Western Harbour Crossing and Route 3.

12. Review of the roles and functions of taxis and van-type light goods vehicles in the public transport services sector

October 2006

The item was discussed by the Panel on 24 March 2006. The Panel urged the Administration to examine and report back in October 2006 the need for and feasibility of amending the Road Traffic Ordinance (Cap. 374) and its subsidiary legislation to better confine the operation of van-type light goods vehicles to carriage of goods for hire or reward.
