INTRODUCTION

Section 29A of the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance (Cap. 1) stipulates that, where a fee is for the time being specified in subsidiary legislation made by the Chief Executive in Council, the Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury may by similar subsidiary legislation vary the fee.

- 2. The Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury has now exercised this power by making:
 - (a) the Road Traffic Ordinance (Amendment of Schedule 5 Charge Revision) Order 2005;
 - (b) the Road Traffic (Driving Licences)(Fee Reduction) Regulation 2005;
 - (c) the Road Traffic (Registration and Licensing of Vehicles)(Fee Reduction) Regulation 2005; and

(d) the Road Traffic (Village Vehicles)(Fee Reduction) Regulation 2005.

The four Order and Regulations are at <u>Annex A</u>. The amendment exercise aims to revise 15 transport-related fees and charges payable under the Road Traffic Ordinance (Cap. 374) and its subsidiary legislations.

JUSTIFICATIONS

- 3. It is Government's policy that fees and charges charged by the Government should in general be set at a level sufficient to recover the full cost of providing the services. In the 2004-05 Budget Speech, the Financial Secretary indicated the need to resume the revision of Government fees and charges. We have carried out a costing exercise to review the costs of providing certain transport-related services.
- 4. Based on the outcome of the costing review, we propose to adjust the fees and charges of 15 transport related services being provided by the Transport Department and Hong Kong Police Force. We propose to raise one fee and decrease the other 14 to full cost level¹. The proposed adjustments range from -61% to +10%. Details are set out at **Annex B**.
- 5. We regularly review and streamline the relevant work procedures and implement efficiency initiatives to reduce or contain costs in providing the services. Such efficiency savings have been reflected in the proposed fee adjustments.

THE ORDER AND THE REGULATIONS

6. The Order and the Regulations at <u>Annex A</u> seek to revise the fees under the Road Traffic Ordinance and its subsidiary legislations set out at <u>Annex B</u>. We propose that the new fees should come into effect on 16 December 2005.

Bureau, for fees with existing cost recovery rate of over 70% of target, the fee increase would be implemented in a phased manner to achieve full-cost recovery within 3 years through an annual increase of 10%. Fee reductions to full-cost

recovery level will be implemented in one go.

IMPLICATIONS OF THE PROPOSAL

8. The proposed legislative amendments are in conformity with the Basic Law, including the provisions concerning human rights, and do not affect the binding effect of the legislations to be amended. The proposed fee revisions have no staffing implications. They would result in a net reduction of around \$0.92 million in Government revenue per year.

PUBLIC CONSULTATION

9. We consulted the Legislative Council Panel on Transport on 24 June 2005 regarding the proposed fee revisions. Members had no objection to the proposal.

ROAD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE (AMENDMENT OF SCHEDULE 5 - CHARGE REVISION) ORDER 2005

(Made by the Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury under section 29A of the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance (Cap. 1) by virtue of section 105(2) of the Road Traffic Ordinance (Cap. 374))

1. Commencement

This Order shall come into operation on 16 December 2005.

2. Removal and storage charges

Schedule 5 to the Road Traffic Ordinance (Cap. 374) is amended -

- (a) in item 1(a) by repealing "440" and substituting
 "485";
- (b) in item 1(c) by repealing "2,960" and substituting "2,790";
- (c) in item 2 by repealing "175" and substituting "160".

Explanatory Note

This Order -

- (a) increases the removal charge for a vehicle having a permitted gross vehicle weight not exceeding 5.5 tonnes from \$440 to \$485;
- (b) reduces the removal charge for a vehicle having a permitted gross vehicle weight exceeding 24 tonnes from \$2,960 to \$2,790; and
- (c) reduces the storage charge for a vehicle detained under the Road Traffic Ordinance (Cap. 374) from \$175 to \$160 per day.

- (a) in item 2(i) by repealing "97" and substituting "50";
- (b) in item 2(j) by repealing "97" and substituting "50".

This Regulation reduces the fees for the issue of the record of convictions and certificate of no recorded convictions from \$97\$ to \$50.

1. Commencement

This Regulation shall come into operation on 16 December 2005.

- (b) under the subheading "Permit and Certificate

 - (ii) in item 10, by repealing "220" and substituting "200";
 - (iii) in item 11, by repealing "220" and substituting "200";
 - (iv) in item 12, by repealing "130" and substituting "110";
 - (v) in item 13, by repealing "185" and substituting "145".
