

L.N. 94 of 2006**CHINESE MEDICINE (FEE REVISION) REGULATION 2006**

(Made by the Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury under section 29A of the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance (Cap. 1) by virtue of section 161(1) of the Chinese Medicine Ordinance (Cap. 549))

1. Commencement

This Regulation shall come into operation on 1 July 2006.

2. Fees

The Schedule to the Chinese Medicine (Fees) Regulation (Cap. 549 sub. leg. E) is amended—

- (a) in item 1, by repealing “1,100” and substituting “1,210”;
- (b) in item 2, by repealing “995” and substituting “1,090”;
- (c) in item 3, by repealing “1,100” and substituting “1,210”;
- (d) in item 4, by repealing “2,890” and substituting “3,180”;
- (e) in item 5, by repealing “955” and substituting “1,050”;
- (f) in item 6, by repealing “955” and substituting “1,050”;
- (g) in item 7, by repealing “850” and substituting “935”;
- (h) in item 8, by repealing “2,440” and substituting “2,680”;
- (i) in item 9, by repealing “140” and substituting “130”;
- (j) in item 10, by repealing “700” and substituting “805”;
- (k) in item 11, by repealing “26,650” and substituting “29,300”.

Explanatory Note

This Regulation amends the Schedule to the Chinese Medicine (Fees) Regulation (Cap. 549 sub. leg. E)—

- (a) to reduce the fee payable for the issue of a certified copy of a licence or certificate for Chinese herbal medicines traders, proprietary Chinese medicines and proprietary Chinese medicines traders; and
- (b) to increase the fees payable for the issue and renewal of a wholesaler licence in Chinese herbal medicines, the issue and renewal of a retailer licence in Chinese herbal medicines, the issue and renewal of a wholesaler licence in proprietary Chinese medicines, the issue and renewal of a manufacturer licence in proprietary Chinese medicines, the change of the address of the premises specified in a licence and the issue of a certificate for manufacturer (good practices in manufacture) under the Chinese Medicine Ordinance (Cap. 549).
