LC Paper No. LS3/07-08

Paper for the Bills Committee on Energy Efficiency (Labelling of Products) Bill

At its meeting on 4 October 2007, the Bills Committee discussed whether the charge of HK\$1,027 per tonne for the disposal of compact fluorescent lamps ("CFLs") in the Chemical Waste Treatment Centre ("CWTC") could be waived. The Legal Adviser to the Bills Committee was requested to advise on the matter.

- 2. According to the Administration, the CWTC provides treatment service for public and private organizations which may need to dispose large quantities of used CFLs and fluorescent tubes (CB(1)2347/06-07(01) refers). A charge of HK\$1,027 per tonne is payable for treatment and disposal of CFLs and fluorescent tubes under regulation 5 of and Schedule 1 to the Waste Disposal (Charges for Disposal of Chemical Waste) Regulation (Cap. 354 sub. leg. J) ("the Regulation"). To encourage the use and proper disposal of CFLs, members proposed that the disposal charge should be waived. Some members of the Bills Committee asked whether it is mandatory for the Administration to collect the disposal charge or it has the power to waive the charge.
- 3. Members may note that regulation 6(1) of the Regulation provides the Director of Environmental Protection ("the Director") with a discretion to reduce or waive, in whole or in part, any charge payable under the Regulation if he is satisfied that the charge would, if imposed, be unduly burdensome or inappropriate in the circumstances of a particular case. Thus, the Director has a discretionary power to waive the charge for the disposal of CFLs in the CWTC which may be exercised in accordance with the usual administrative law principles.
- 4. The relevant provisions are attached for members' reference.

- (1) The charge payable to the Director for the disposal of chemical waste (other than special chemical waste) specified in column 2 of Schedule 1 shall be the charge specified opposite thereto in column 3 of that Schedule.
- (2) The charge payable to the Director for the disposal of special chemical waste specified in column 2 of Schedule 2 shall be the charge specified opposite thereto in column 3 of that Schedule.
- (3) For the avoidance of doubt, it is hereby declared that any disposal of chemical waste may involve two or more of the disposals of chemical waste specified in column 2 of Schedule 1 or column 2 of Schedule 2, as the case may be.

(1) The Director may reduce or waive, in whole or in part, any charge payable under this Regulation if in any particular case he is satisfied that the charge would, if imposed, be unduly burdensome or inappropriate in the circumstances of that case.
