<u>The Bills Committee</u> completed scrutiny of Clauses 43 to 50 and considered issues relating to Clause 94 of the Bill (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).

2. <u>The Administration</u> was requested to -

Clauses 45 & 46

- (a) elaborate on the meaning of "reasonably and in good faith" in Clause 45(2)(c), and consider revising Clause 45(3)(a) to read "any form of speaking, writing, printing or other recorded material that has been communicated to the public" in order to clarify the meaning;
- (b) explain the meaning of "activity in public" in Clause 45(3) and include "communication through the Internet" in Clause 45(3)(a), and clarify whether a private act <u>not</u> communicated to the public would also be covered:
- (c) consider revising the expression "which includes" in Clause 46(1) to make the scope of the provision more definite;
- (d) advise whether a person would be caught by Clause 45 or 46 if he spoke in private something which might incite hatred against persons of a particular race and his words had been disseminated through the Internet without that person's consent;
- (e) elaborate on the purposes of Clauses 45 and 46 from the policy point of view and the specific acts to be targeted;
- (f) provide comparable legislation in Australia and case law and review the compatibility of Clauses 45 and 46 with the right to freedom of speech protected under the Basic Law;
- (g) explain whether conspiracy offence would be covered by Clause 46 by application of principles of the common law;
- (h) explain whether the yardstick for determining whether an act constituted incitement was an objective one;

Clause 48

(i) explain whether the reference to "knowingly" in Clause 48(3)(a) would tantamount to making "ignorance of the law" a defence;

Action

(j) provide justifications for Clause 48(4) which rendered the making of a false statement an offence; and

Clauses 50 and 94

(k) provide information on the background and rationale for the proposed amendment under Clause 94 to the Chinese Permanent Cemeteries Ordinance (Cap. 1112).
