Admin 2. <u>The Administration</u> was requested to -

- (a) consider moving Committee Stage amendments (CSAs) to Clauses 71(1)(b) and 81(3) as suggested in paragraph 34 of EOC's paper as well as corresponding amendments to other existing anti-discrimination ordinances;
- (b) review the issue that Disability Discrimination Ordinance (DDO) and Family Status Discrimination Ordinance did not contain a provision similar to Clause 63 of the Bill;
- (c) review the issue that Clause 71(6) was modeled on a similar provision in Sex Discrimination Ordinance but no equivalent provision was found in DDO;
- (d) consider whether the reference to "Section 67(4)" in Clause 72(5) should be revised to read "Section 67(5)";
- (e) provide justification for the proposed amendments under Clauses 89 and 94 for the Bills Committee to consider the implications of the proposed amendments; and
- (f) move a CSA to Clause 93 to further expand the scope of sexual harassment as undertaken in the letter dated 30 May 2008 from the Secretary to Constitutional and Mainland Affairs to the

- 3. At the suggestion of members, the Chief Legal Counsel of EOC agreed to -
 - (a) provide supplementary information on the actual operation of the existing mechanism covered by Clause 78; and
 - (b) convey to EOC for consideration Miss CHAN Yuen-han's suggestion that its functions of investigations and conciliation should be handled separately for the sake of maintaining its neutrality.

 - (a) the composition of EOC should be reviewed in the light of experience gained from implementation of the existing anti-discrimination ordinances, such as the need for appointing representatives from non-governmental organizations relating to equal opportunities issues; and
 - (b) the proposed establishment of the Equal Opportunities Tribunal as elaborated in paragraph 28 of the EOC's paper.
