# **Bills Committee on Statute Law** (Miscellaneous Provisions) Bill 2007

The Bills Committee deliberated (index of proceedings attached at Annex).

#### I. Meeting with the Administration

Part 7 of the Bill concerning wasted costs in criminal proceedings

- 2. <u>Solicitor General, Department of Justice (SG/DoJ)</u> briefed members on the Administration's proposed amendments to Part 7 of the Bill to reflect The Hong Kong Bar Association's alternative position on the definition of "wasted costs" as set out in its paper (LC Paper No. CB(2)1482/07-08(01)).
- 3. The Chairman advised that the Law Society of Hong Kong had indicated that it did not think the Administration's proposed amendments had addressed its concerns and reiterated that it could not support the legislative proposal put forward in Part 7 of the Bill. Members noted that the Law Society had indicated its support for the views of the Bar Association vide its earlier letter dated 10 October 2007.
- 4. While agreeing with the Administration's proposed amendments to narrow down the definition of "wasted costs", the Chairman and Mr Ronny TONG expressed concern about the threshold for making a wasted cost order under sub-paragraph 2(a)(ii) of the definition of "wasted costs" as the meaning of "any undue delay" and "any other misconduct" were too wide and uncertain. They considered that the jurisdiction to make a wasted costs order should be invoked only where there was a seriously improper act or omission, undue delay amounting

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to or caused by serious misconduct, or any other serious misconduct. To maintain a consistent threshold for making wasted costs orders under sub-paragraph 2(a)(i) and (a)(ii), <u>members</u> requested the Administration to review the wording of sub-paragraph 2(a)(ii). <u>The Administration</u> agreed to consider.

- 5. <u>Assistant Legal Adviser 2</u> pointed out that apart from suggesting amendments to the definition of "wasted costs", the Bar Association, in its submission, also proposed to extend the application of the proposed section 18(6) of the Costs in Criminal Cases Ordinance (Cap. 492) to all counsel appearing on behalf of the Government or the legal aid fund so that wasted costs orders against them were to be borne by the general revenue or to delete the proposed section 18(6) of Cap. 492 in this regard.
- 6. <u>SG/DoJ</u> explained that the subject matter was separate from the scope of the definition of "wasted costs" in section 2 of the Costs in Criminal Cases Ordinance. The purpose of the subsection was to provide a fund out of which the costs of the other party would be paid and ensure that the costs would be met from the general revenue.

#### Proposed Committee Stage amendment (CSA) to be moved by the Administration

7. <u>Members</u> noted that the Administration would propose an additional CSA to make a technical amendment to clause 78 of the Bill as detailed in LC Paper No. CB(2)1510/07-08(01). Members raise no questions on the CSA.

#### Way forward

8. <u>Members</u> agreed that subject to the Administration acceding to members' suggestion of further amending the definition of "wasted costs" under Part 7 of the Bill, the Bills Committee would not hold further meetings to discuss the Administration's response and would report its deliberations to the House Committee. Should the Administration's reply be negative, the Bills Committee would reconsider its previous decision to move a CSA to delete the proposed amendments under Part 7 of the Bill.

#### II. Any other business

9. There being no other business, the meeting ended at 9:32 am.
