## **I. Meeting with the Administration**

The Bills Committee deliberated (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).

2. The Bills Committee requested the Administration -
  - (a) to reconsider establishing a platform for communication between the Police and vulnerable groups on a regular basis; and
  - (b) to consider revising the scope of reportable complaints as previously suggested by the Bills Committee, and revising the substitutes proposed for the Chinese and English version of the terms "reportable complaint" and "non-reportable complaint" having regard to the views expressed by members.
3. The Chairman recalled that a deputation had alleged at the Bills Committee meeting on 6 December 2007 that there were cases where Police

officers forewarned another Police officer of the complaint against him. He asked the Secretariat to request the deputation to provide further information for forwarding to the Administration for follow-up.

4. The Bills Committee agreed to invite representatives of the Independent Police Complaints Council (IPCC) to join the meeting at which IPCC's further submission regarding its observations on the Administration's response of January 2008 and the Administration's response to IPCC's further submission were to be discussed.

## **II. Date of next meeting**

5. The Bills Committee noted that the next meeting had been scheduled for 13 March 2008 at 10:45 am to continue discussion with the Administration.
