I. Confirmation of the minutes of the 2nd meeting held on 20 October 2006 (LC Paper No. CB(2) 217/06-07)

The minutes were confirmed.

II. Matters arising

Report by the Chairman on her meeting with the Chief Secretary for Administration (CS)

2. The Chairman said that there was nothing special to report.

III. Business arising from previous Council meetings

- (a) Legal Service Division report on subsidiary legislation gazetted on 20 October 2006 and tabled in Council on 25 October 2006
 (LC Paper No. LS 5/06-07)
- 3. The Chairman said that a total of 10 items of subsidiary legislation were gazetted on 20 October 2006 and tabled in Council on 25 October 2006.
- 4. <u>Members</u> did not raise any queries on the 10 items of subsidiary legislation.
- 5. <u>The Chairman</u> reminded Members that the deadline for amending these items of subsidiary legislation was 22 November 2006.
- (b) Legal Service Division report on subsidiary legislation gazetted on 27 October 2006 and tabled in Council on 1 November 2006
 (LC Paper No. LS 6/06-07)

- 6. <u>The Chairman</u> said that a total of 15 items of subsidiary legislation were gazetted on 27 October 2006 and tabled in Council on 1 November 2006.
- 7. Regarding the Banking (Capital) Rules and the Banking (Disclosure) Rules, the Legal Adviser said that the Legal Service Division was continuing the scrutiny of the Rules and would provide a further report, if necessary.
- 8. As regards the six pieces of subsidiary legislation relating to the relocation of juveniles to the Tuen Mun Children and Juvenile Home, the Legal Adviser said that the relocation proposal had been discussed by the Panel on Welfare Services in May 2003. Mr Albert HO suggested that a decision on the subsidiary legislation be deferred to the next meeting of the House Committee. Members agreed.
- 9. <u>Members</u> did not raise any queries on the other nine items of subsidiary legislation.
- 10. <u>The Chairman</u> reminded Members that the deadline for amending these items of subsidiary legislation was 29 November 2006.

- 11. <u>The Chairman</u> said that at the House Committee meeting on 13 October 2006, Members were informed that the Legal Service Division was scrutinising the four Regulations and would provide a further report, if necessary.
- 12. <u>The Legal Adviser</u> said that in response to certain drafting points raised by the Legal Service Division, the Administration proposed to move a motion to amend the Regulations. <u>The Legal Adviser</u> added that as the first scrutiny period of 28 days would expire after 8 November 2006, the Legal Service Division recommended that the scrutiny period for the subsidiary legislation be extended to 29 November 2006.

13. <u>The Chairman</u> proposed to move, in her capacity as Chairman of the House Committee, a motion to extend the scrutiny period for the subsidiary legislation at the Council meeting on 8 November 2006. <u>Members</u> agreed.

- 22. <u>The Chairman</u> said that the above motion would be moved by Mr LEUNG Yiu-chung, and the wording of the motion had been issued to Members.
- 23. <u>The Chairman</u> reminded Members that the deadline for giving notice of amendments, if any, to the motions was Wednesday, 8 November 2006.

VII. Report of Bills Committees and subcommittees

Report of the Subcommittee to Study Western Harbour Crossing Ordinance (Replacement of Schedule 1) Notice 2006 and Tai Lam Tunnel and Yuen Long Approach Road Ordinance (Toll Increase) Notice 2006 (LC Paper No. CB(1) 211/06-07)

- 24. The Chairman, in her capacity as the Chairman of the Subcommittee, said that the Subcommittee had held a meeting with the Administration and the two tunnel companies concerned to discuss the Notices, which were not required to be tabled in the Legislative Council (LegCo) and were not subject to amendment by LegCo.
- 25. <u>The Chairman</u> further said that the Subcommittee noted that despite the increase in statutory tolls, there was no actual increase in the tolls paid by users as the franchisees concerned had continued to offer concessions to all types of vehicles.
- 26. The Chairman added that the Subcommittee had also expressed concern about the uneven distribution of traffic among the three road harbour crossings, and had urged the Administration to expedite the formulation of measures to achieve traffic diversion among the various tunnels.

VIII. Position on Bills Committees and subcommittees

(LC Paper No. CB(2) 218/06-07)

- 27. <u>The Chairman</u> said that there were nine Bills Committees and five subcommittees under the House Committee in action.
- 28. Noting the availability of Bills Committee slots, <u>Ms Audrey EU</u> expressed concern about the pace on the part of the Administration in introducing the 27 bills on the legislative programme for 2006-2007. <u>Ms EU</u> said that some of these bills were controversial and involved complicated issues. To allow sufficient time for Members to scrutinise the bills, the Administration should introduce the bills on the legislative programme as soon as possible and avoid bunching of bills at the end of the session. <u>Ms EU</u> considered that the Administration should be requested to provide a specific time frame for the introduction of the bills on the legislative programme.
- 29. <u>Ms Margaret NG</u> said that she was given to know that the Administration was considering substantial amendments to the Land Titles Ordinance, which was not on the legislative programme for 2006-2007. <u>Ms NG</u> considered it important that Members would have sufficient time to scrutinise the proposed amendments.
- 30. <u>Dr YEUNG Sum</u> said that the Administration should advise the time for introducing the Prevention of Bribery (Amendment) Bill.

31. <u>The Chairman</u> agreed to convey Members' concerns and requests to CS concerning the timetable for introducing the bills on the legislative programme and amendments to the Land Titles Ordinance.

IX. Any other business

32. There being no other business, the meeting ended at 2:44 pm.
