Activation of the Subcommittee on Heritage Conservation of the Panel on Home Affairs

Purpose

This paper invites Members to consider whether the captioned subcommittee should be activated.

Background

- 2. At the House Committee (HC) meeting on 2 March 2007, Members agreed that the maximum number of subcommittees on policy issues and Council business other than subsidiary legislation, other instruments and senior judicial appointments should be eight. When eight such subcommittees are already in operation and new subcommittee(s) has been appointed, a waiting list will be formed. If the number of Bills Committees is less than 16, HC may activate subcommittees on the waiting list after having considered the following:
 - (a) the number of vacant slots for Bills Committees;
 - (b) the number of bills likely to be introduced to the Council in the next three months;
 - (c) the number of subcommittees on subsidiary legislation already or likely to be appointed by HC and by Bills Committees; and
 - (d) the availability of resources in the Secretariat.
- 3. Members noted that 11 such subcommittees were already in operation.

Latest position

- 4. At its meeting on 11 May 2007, the Panel on Home Affairs decided to appoint a Subcommittee on Heritage Conservation. In accordance with the decision of HC, the subcommittee has been put on the waiting list. Since there are vacant Bills Committee slots, HC is invited to consider if it should be activated.
- 5. Information relating to the subcommittee including its terms of reference, work plan and time frame is in **Appendix I** for Members' reference. A position report on the existing and anticipated number of Bills Committees and subcommittees is in **Appendix II** to facilitate Members' consideration of the factors listed in paragraph 2.

Advice sought

6. Members are invited to decide whether the subcommittee should be activated.

Subcommittee on Heritage Conservation of the Panel on Home Affairs

Terms of reference

The Subcommittee will review the planning for redevelopment and/or preservation projects relating to buildings or sites with unique heritage value, including the Nga Tsin Wai Village project, the Dragon Garden project and other similar projects.

Work plan and time frame

- 2. The Subcommittee will focus its work on the following major areas -
 - (a) review of the planning for the Nga Tsin Wai Village project and the Dragon Garden project, as well as other similar projects with heritage value which are under threat;
 - (b) monitoring of the Government and relevant authorities in taking forward these redevelopment and/or preservation projects to ensure that relevant buildings and sites with unique heritage value will be preserved; and
 - (c) discussions with the Government and relevant parties on feasible alternatives to preserve relevant buildings or sites.
- 3. The Subcommittee may also meet with deputations to receive their views on individual projects. The Subcommittee will complete its work within 12 months of its commencement and report to the Panel on Home Affairs in June 2008.
