 - (a) Provide an undertaking that it would consult the trades on the feasibility of imposing liability on retailers who knowingly sell regulated products exceeding the prescribed limits on volatile organic compounds (VOCs) under the Regulation;
 - (b) Review the drafting of sections 4(1)(a) and (b) to ensure that a label was affixed as prescribed on the container of a regulated paint regardless of whether it had packaging or not;
 - (c) Provide an undertaking that any alternative methods on the determination of VOC content of regulated paints would be uploaded onto the website of the Environmental Protection Department for public reference;

- (d) Re-consider the need for reports on regulated printing inks under section 11 if such reports were not required upon importation of the products. The requirement for reports might have accorded the Administration with excessive power, particularly when these reports were mainly used for statistical purpose but non-compliance or provision of misleading/false information would be subject to imprisonment under section 17; and
- (e) Consider replacing the phrase "a regulated product that" with "goods" under section 20 to ensure consistency with the definition of "goods in transit" under section 2.
