Action

I. Election of Chairman

Mr James TO was elected Chairman of the Subcommittee.

II. Meeting with the Administration

(Legislative Council Brief (File Ref. SBCR 3/5691/95 Pt.36; SBCR 1/2716/89(98) Pt.22), LS12/06-07 and LC Paper Nos. CB(2)573/06-07(01)-(03))

- 2. The Subcommittee deliberated (index of proceedings at **Annex**).
- 3. <u>Senior Government Counsel</u> (SGC) took members through the Administration's paper on an article by article comparison of the Agreement between the Government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region and the Government of the Federal Republic of Germany for surrender of fugitive offenders (SFO) and the model text on SFO (LC Paper No. CB(2) 573/06-07(02)).

Main issues raised

4. <u>The Chairman</u> expressed concern on whether the removal of the reference to "magistrate" in Article 8(3) of the Fugitive Offenders (Germany) Order (the Germany Order) would render it impossible for Hong Kong to request Germany to surrender a fugitive offender to Hong Kong if the warrant of arrest was issued by a magistrate in Hong Kong, and asked the Administration why such an arrangement was acceptable to Hong Kong.

5. <u>SGC</u> explained that "magistrate" was removed from Article 8(3) of the Germany Order at the request of Germany on the grounds that magistrates in Germany did not have the power to issue warrant of arrest. <u>SGC</u> however pointed out that such removal would not render it impossible for Hong Kong to request Germany to surrender a fugitive offender to Hong Kong if the warrant of arrest was issued by a magistrate in Hong Kong as Germany recognised that magistrates in Hong Kong had such power and it was understood by both sides that "other competent authority" referred to in the Article covered magistrate. At the request of the Chairman, <u>Principal Assistant Secretary for Security</u> (PAS(S)) agreed to prepare a paper affirming this point.

- 6. The Chairman noted that the provisional arrest of the person sought would be terminated upon the expiration of 60 days in Article 10 of the Germany Order, as opposed to only 45 days provided for in Article 8 of the model agreement. Although precedent for such extension could be found in Article 9 of the Netherlands agreement, the Chairman urged the Administration to exercise prudence in agreeing to similar provision in future SFO agreements in order not to undermine human rights.
- 7. The Chairman was of the view that Hong Kong should receive a share of the profits realised from property confiscated by the requesting party from a person so surrendered by Hong Kong to cover expenses borne for surrendering the person. Ms Miriam LAU cautioned that this matter might be taken into account if international trend or practice was to allow the requested party to receive a share of the confiscated proceeds concerned.

- 8. <u>PAS(S)</u> responded that the Fugitive Offenders Ordinance (Cap. 503) under which the Germany Order was made did not provide for the sharing of confiscated proceeds as suggested by the Chairman in paragraph 7 above. Nevertheless, <u>PAS(S)</u> took note of the Chairman's view and would explore whether and how this should be done through administrative means or other bilateral/international agreements.
- 9. Referring to Article 20 of the Germany Order providing for the expeditious surrendering of the person without further formal proceedings if the person concerned consented voluntarily and in writing to surrender to the requesting party, the Chairman asked about the legal assistance available to a person who refused to be surrendered to the requesting party voluntarily.
- 10. <u>SGC</u> advised that at the Magistrates' Courts, an arrested person could ask for representation by lawyers provided by the Duty Lawyer Scheme. For proceedings above the Magistrates' Court level, an arrested person could apply to the Legal Aid Department (LAD) for assisted legal representation. At the request of the Chairman, <u>PAS(S)</u> agreed to provide a written factual account of the legal assistance available to such persons, including the legal procedures involved and whether under the duty lawyers service at the Magistrates' Courts

and the legal service provided by the LAD could deal with cases involving surrender of fugitive offenders.

III. Any other business

- 11. To allow more time for members to scrutinise the Germany Order and the Fugitive Offenders (Republic of Korea) Order, the Chairman said that he would give notice to move a motion at the Council meeting on 20 December 2006 to extend the scrutiny period of the two Orders to 10 January 2007. A verbal report on this would be made to the House Committee on 15 December 2006.
- 12. The meeting ended at 3:24 pm.
