Action

I. Election of Chairman and Deputy Chairman

(Appendix IV to LC Paper No. CB(2)2/06-07 – Terms of reference of the Panel

Election of Chairman

<u>Dr LUI Ming-wah</u>, Chairman of the Panel in office, called for nominations for chairmanship of the Panel. Mr Alan LEONG was nominated by Ms Emily LAU and the nomination was seconded by Ms Margaret NG. <u>Mr LEONG</u> accepted the nomination. <u>Dr LUI</u> called for other nominations.

- 2. Dr LUI Ming-wah was nominated by Mr Abraham SHEK and the nomination was seconded by Mr TAM Yiu-chung. <u>Dr LUI</u> accepted the nomination. <u>Mr Jasper TSANG</u>, Deputy Chairman of the Panel in office, took the chair and presided over the election of Chairman. <u>Mr TSANG</u> called for other nominations. There was no other nomination. In response to the request of Ms Emily LAU, <u>Mr TSANG</u> declared that the meeting should proceed to the presentation of platform and answering of questions by the candidates nominated for the chairmanship. He invited each member nominated for the office of the Chairman to speak not more than two minutes.
- 3. Mr Alan LEONG said that constitutional reform had a direct bearing on effective governance. It was now a critical time for Hong Kong to review its political system. The Legislative Council had a constitutional duty to provide a platform for discussion on constitutional reform, with a view to formulating a proposal that could be accepted by all parties concerned. If elected as Chairman, he would make the best endeavour to ensure that the Panel would discharge its constitutional function effectively.
- 4. <u>Dr LUI Ming-wah</u> said that his commitment as Chairman was evidenced by his past service. If elected, he would continue to ensure that Members and persons attending meetings were given opportunities to freely express their views. As regards constitutional reform, he believed in the concerted efforts of Panel members, the Administration and various stakeholders to come up with a proposal after discussion. His role as Chairman was to facilitate input and collaborative efforts from various parties.
- 5. <u>Ms Emily LAU</u> said that the Commission on Strategic Development (CSD), which was entrusted by the Administration to study models for implementing universal suffrage for selecting the Chief Executive and for forming LegCo, was operated behind closed door because members of the public and many LegCo Members could not participate in its discussions. <u>Ms LAU</u> held the view that Dr LUI, as Chairman of Panel in the last session, had not worked hard to promote discussion of the subject by the Panel. She asked how Dr LUI would ensure that the Panel would provide a platform for active discussion on constitutional development in the coming session.

- 6. <u>Dr LUI Ming-wah</u> responded that constitutional development could be discussed widely by different parties in the community, and CSD was just one of the fora for discussion. Any proposals put forth by CSD on how universal suffrage would be implemented would be subject to the scrutiny and approval of LegCo. In the coming session, the Panel would continue to provide a forum for the exchange and dissemination of views on this issue. He would welcome suggestions from Panel members on better ways to take forward the matter.
- 7. <u>Mr Albert CHAN</u>, a non-Panel member, queried the competence of Dr LUI as Panel Chairman, as he had observed that Dr LUI had to rely on the advice of the Deputy Chairman on many occasions in the conduct of Panel meetings in the past two sessions.
- 8. <u>Dr LUI Ming-wah</u> responded that the observation made by Mr Albert CHAN was not fair, as he recalled that Mr CHAN had not attended all the Panel meetings. He said that he had sought the advice of the Deputy Chairman on a few occasions, especially when controversial issues were discussed, in order to ensure the smooth conduct of Panel business. After all, it was the duty of both the Chairman and Deputy Chairman to ensure that Panel meetings were effectively conducted.
- 9. As members did not raise any more questions with the candidates, Mr Jasper TSANG announced a vote by secret ballot. After all the members had cast their votes, Mr TSANG invited Ms Emily LAU and Mr Abraham SHEK, who had nominated the two candidates, to monitor the counting of votes.
- 10. <u>Mr TSANG</u> announced that eight and 24 members voted for Mr Alan LEONG and Dr LUI Ming-wah respectively, and declared Dr LUI elected as the Chairman of the Panel for the 2006-2007 session.

Election of Deputy Chairman

- 11. <u>The Chairman</u> took the chair and called for nominations for the deputy chairmanship of the Panel. Mr TAM Yiu-chung was nominated by Mrs Sophie LEUNG and the nomination was seconded by Mr Abraham SHEK. <u>Mr TAM</u> accepted the nomination. <u>The Chairman</u> called for other nominations.
- 12. Mr Alan LEONG was nominated by Ms Emily LAU and the nomination was seconded by Ms Margaret NG. Mr LEONG accepted the nomination. The Chairman called for other nominations. As there was no other nomination, the Chairman announced a vote by secret ballot. After all the members had cast their votes, the Chairman invited Mrs Sophie LEUNG and Ms Emily LAU, who had nominated the two candidates, to monitor the counting of votes.

13. <u>The Chairman</u> announced that 24 and seven members voted for Mr TAM Yiu-chung and Mr Alan LEONG respectively, and declared Mr TAM elected as the Deputy Chairman of the Panel for the 2006-2007 session.

II. Schedule of meetings for the 2006-2007 session

14. <u>Members</u> agreed that future regular meetings of the Panel would be held on the third Monday of each month at 2:30 pm. As in the last session, the duration of the regular meetings would be three hours. As the third Monday of February 2007 was a public holiday and the third Monday of June 2007 fell between two public holidays, <u>members</u> agreed that the regular meetings of the Panel for those two months be rescheduled. A schedule of meetings would be worked out with the Chairman after the meeting and circulated to Panel members.
