2. The Subcommittee deliberated (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).
3. Members agreed that there was no need to revise the Terms of Reference of the Subcommittee.
4. Members further agreed that the Subcommittee would focus its study on three major areas -
  - (a) the existing framework for the protection of human rights in Hong Kong;
  - (b) the setting up of a human rights commission in Hong Kong; and
  - (c) the implementation of the recommendations made in the Concluding Observations or Concluding Comments issued by the United Nations human rights treaty bodies.
5. Members agreed that the Subcommittee should discuss with the academics who had responded to the enquiries of the Research and Library Services Division of the Legislative Council Secretariat and representatives of the Hong Kong Human Rights Monitor their views on the existing human rights framework in Hong Kong at its next meeting. Members also agreed that the Administration should be requested to provide a written response to the views of these academics and attend the next meeting.
6. Members further agreed that the Subcommittee would complete its study and provide a report to the Panel on Home Affairs in June 2008.
7. Members noted that the Clerk would draw up a work plan of the Subcommittee for endorsement by circulation which would be submitted to the Panel on Home Affairs and the House Committee for information.
