I Election of Chairman

Mr CHAN Kam-lam, the member with the highest precedence among those who were present at the meeting, presided over the election of the Chairman of the Bills Committee. He invited nominations for the chairmanship of the Bills Committee.

2. Mr CHAN Kam-lam was nominated by Mr WONG Ting-kwong and seconded by Mr Andrew LEUNG. Mr CHAN accepted the nomination. There being no other nominations, Mr CHAN Kam-lam was elected the Chairman.

3. <u>Members</u> noted the written application (tabled at the meeting) of Miss TAM Heung-man for late membership. According to Miss TAM, she had not signified her membership before the deadline due to staff changes in her office. The Bills Committee accepted Miss TAM's late application. <u>The Chairman</u> also

Declaration of interest

5. <u>Mr WONG Ting-kwong</u> declared that he was a member of the Committee to Oversee MPFA's Implementation of the Government Injection Project set up under the MPFA.

Follow-up actions to be taken by the Administration/Mandatory Provident Fund Schemes Authority (MPFA)

Admin/ MPFA 6. In relation to the concerns raised by members of the Bills Committee about the proposed one-off injection of \$6,000 (hereinafter referred to as the special contribution) into the Mandatory Provident Fund (MPF) accounts of employees and self-employed persons earning not more than \$10,000 a month, the Administration/the MPFA were requested to consider/respond to the following views and suggestions:

- (a) allowing eligible members of MPF schemes/MPF-exempted occupational retirement schemes (ORSO) to withdraw the special contribution at any time prior to attaining the age of 65, such as by making the special contribution as a voluntary contribution not subject to the preservation requirement;
- (b) the feasibility of using the average monthly income over the 12 months from 1 March 2007 to 29 February 2008 to assess whether an MPF/ORSO scheme member could fulfillthe income eligibility criterion; and
- (c) for the purpose of determining the eligibility of MPF/ORSO scheme members, the feasibility of collecting information on their monthly income for the period from 1 March 2007 to 29 February 2008, instead of just the month of the anchored income and the two immediately preceding months.

Admin/ MPFA

- 7. The Administration/the MPFA were requested to confirm/advise whether and how persons under the following scenarios would be eligible for receiving the special contribution:
 - (a) persons (retired or still in employment) aged between 60 and 65 and persons over 65 years of age;
 - (b) an employee who passed away on or after 1 March 2008;
 - (c) those employees whose employers had not duly enrolled them to an MPF scheme on or before 29 February 2008;
 - (d) a person who was unemployed throughout the one-year period from 1 March 2007 to 29 February 2008; and
 - (e) a person who earned more than \$10,000 a month during the first half of the one-year period in question but who became unemployed during the latter half of the one-year period.

Admin/ MPFA

- 8. The Administration/the MPFA were requested to provide the following information:
 - (a) a breakdown of the number of MPF/ORSO scheme members earning between \$10,000 \$10,999 and \$11,000 \$11,999 a month and the tax rebate to which they were entitled as a result of the one-off tax reduction announced in the 2008-09 Budget;
 - (b) how the MPFA's decisions on eligible cases would be disseminated for reference by the public;

- (c) if a person was aggrieved by the MPFA's decision that he was not eligible for the special contribution, the channel or mechanism, if any, for the person to lodge a complaint or an appeal against the MPFA's decision; and
- (d) details of the scenarios or hypothetical cases drawn up by the MPFA for the purpose of studying the eligibility of certain persons.

(*Post-meeting note*: The Administration/MPFA's response to paragraphs 6, 7 and 8 was tabled at the meeting on 30 June 2008. The Chinese and English versions of the paper were subsequently circulated to members vide LC Paper No. CB(1)2066/07-08(01) on 30 June and 8 July 2008 respectively.)

- 10. <u>Members</u> noted that except the deadline for giving notice of Committee Stage amendments (i.e. 28 June 2008), all other deadlines had lapsed. If the Administration intended to resume Second Reading on the Bill on 9 July 2008, the President's permission had to be sought to waive the deadline for giving notice for resumption.
- 11. Mr LEE Cheuk-yan indicated his intention to move a Committee Stage amendment (CSA) to the Bill to the effect that the special contribution would not be subject to the preservation requirement applicable to the accrued benefits

derived from mandatory contributions under an MPF scheme. As such, the eligible persons would be able to withdraw the special contribution at any time prior to attaining the age of 65. In this connection, <u>members</u> noted that at present, the Administration could not give notice for resumption of Second Reading debate unless there was permission from the President to waive the deadline for giving such notice. If the Bills Committee would recommend to support the waiving of the deadline for giving notice for resumption, the usual arrangement was that it would also recommend the waiving of the deadline, if lapsed, for giving notice to move CSAs.
