I. Meeting with the Administration

[The Bill, Legislative Council Brief, LC Paper Nos. LS48/07-08, CB(2)1550/07-08(01) to (03) and CB(2)1734/07-08(01)]

<u>The Bills Committee</u> deliberated (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).

Proposed amendments to various Ordinances containing offence provisions with the drafting formula "to the satisfaction of" an enforcement agency (Parts 2 to 4 of the Bill)

Admin

2. <u>The Administration</u> was requested to provide the offence provisions with the drafting formula "to the satisfaction of" an enforcement agency in various Ordinances and Regulations to be amended under Parts 2 to 4 of the Bill and explain the general statutory requirement specified in these offence provisions.

Action

Proposed amendments to the Conveyancing and Property Ordinance (CPO) (Cap. 219) (Part 6 of the Bill)

Admin

- 3. The Administration was requested to
 - (a) review the drafting of the proposed new section 13A(1) of CPO in the light of the proposed drafting put forward by the Law Society of Hong Kong;
 - (b) consider whether the word "original" should be added to the proposed new section 13A(1); and
 - (c) provide the Hong Kong Bar Association's written views on the drafting of the proposed amendments to CPO as well as views and comments received from consultees on the proposal, if any.

Clerk

- 4. <u>The Chairman</u> instructed the Clerk to seek the Bar Association's views on the drafting of the proposed amendments to CPO, if it had not provided written views to the Administration.
- 5. Ms Angela LEE of the Law Society advised that the risk of the purchaser acquiring a defective title by reason of the existence of third party rights in or against the land was likely to be very remote, and that the rights or interests of the third parties would not be affected under the proposed new section 13A(4). At the Chairman's request, Ms Angela LEE of the Law Society agreed to provide members with the Counsel advice obtained by the Law Society and illustrative examples in this respect.

Law Society

6. Assistant Legal Adviser 2 drew members' attention to the Administration's reply (LC Paper No. CB(2)1550/07-08(03)) to his letter dated 3 April 2008. The Administration advised that the proposed new section 13A of CPO would only apply to transactions in which the sale and purchase agreement was signed on or after the commencement of the proposed amendment. Therefore, the proposed new section 13A would have no effect on past transactions completed before commencement or on transactions in which the sale and purchase agreement had been signed before commencement but was completed after commencement. The Administration considered that there was no requirement for transitional provisions.

II. Any other business

7. <u>Members</u> agreed that further meetings should be scheduled for May and June 2008. <u>The Chairman</u> said that members would be informed of the meeting dates in due course.
