I. Confirmation of minutes

[LC Paper No. CB(2)1809/07-08]

The minutes of meeting held on 18 April 2008 were confirmed.

II. Meeting with the Administration

[The Bill, Legislative Council Brief, LC Paper Nos. LS48/07-08, CB(2)1550/07-08(01) to (03) and CB(2)1878/07-08(01)]

2. The Bills Committee deliberated (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).

Proposed amendments to various Ordinances containing offence provisions with the drafting formula "to the satisfaction of" an enforcement agency (Parts 2 and 3 of the Bill)

- 3. <u>The Bills Committee</u> requested the Administration to
 - (a) seek the views of the relevant authorities on whether and what actions would be taken to inform the person regulated of the specific measures to be taken "to the satisfaction of" those authorities after the relevant provisions were amended as proposed;
 - (b) advise whether a person who had commenced a regulated activity without approaching the relevant authority to ascertain the measures to be taken "to the satisfaction" of that agency would be subject to prosecution, even if the authority had not specified the measures to be taken to its satisfaction;
 - (c) review the Chinese rendition of "as soon as practicable";

Action

- (d) consider whether the proposed new section 11(5)(a) of the Mass Transit Railway Ordinance (Cap. 556) under clause 9 should instead be added to section 11(1) of the Ordinance;
- (e) advise when prosecution would be taken against a person regulated for not ascertaining from the authority, "before the contravention", as to how the authority was to be satisfied for the purposes of regulation 12 or 13 of the Boilers and Pressure Vessels Regulations (Cap. 56A); and
- (f) consider whether it would be more appropriate to specify how the authority (Commissioner of Customs and Excise) was to be satisfied for the purposes of the relevant regulations of the Dutiable Commodities Regulations (Cap. 109A) by administrative measures instead of requiring the person regulated to take actions "to the satisfaction of the Commissioner".
- 4. <u>Members</u> expressed concern about requiring the person regulated to approach the relevant authorities to ascertain measures to be taken "to the satisfaction of" those authorities and whether a person who had commenced a regulated activity without approaching the relevant authority to ascertain the measures to be taken "to the satisfaction of" that authority would be subject to prosecution, after the relevant provisions were amended as proposed. They were concerned that the onus of responsibility would be put on the person regulated. <u>The Administration</u> explained that the proposed amendment sought to regulate a person who had carried on the activity after the relevant authority had imposed the requirement.
- 5. The Chairman recapitulated members that when the "to the satisfaction" formula was discussed by the Panel on Administration of Justice and Legal Services, the concern about requiring the person regulated to approach the relevant authorities to ascertain the measures to be taken "to the satisfaction of" those authorities was raised. She considered that the Administration's response did not address the question raised by members. The Administration was requested to provide a written response to the concern about the requirement and consider deleting the relevant provisions.
