Finance Committee Meeting on 14 December 2007 Issue Requiring Follow-up Actions by the Administration

<u>Item No. 2 - FCR(2007-08)38</u> <u>PWSC(2007-08)54</u>

Issue

At the request of Hon Emily Lau and Hon Kwok Ka-ki, the Administration agreed to report on the outcome of consultation with Central and Western District Council on the opening of the Sun Yat Sen Memorial Park (the Park) for use by pets and the provision of a cycling track in the Park.

Response

Members of the Culture, Leisure and Social Affairs Committee of Central and Western District Council (C&WDC) were consulted on 28 February 2008. They did not support the proposed opening of the Park for use by pets and the provision of a cycling tack in the Park. Nevertheless, the Administration was requested to identify suitable site in the district for a dog garden and consider providing a waterfront cycling track from Central to Western district. The Administration undertook to look into the matter and would report the findings to C&WDC in due course.
