**5. Progress report on registration of Chinese Medicine practitioners (CMPs)**

Subsequent to the meeting on 13 November 2006, the Panel has decided that the issue of providing appropriate assistance to listed CMPs seeking to obtain registration status be made a standing agenda item for discussion by the Panel every six months.

The item was last discussed by the Panel at its meeting on 12 November 2007.

**6. Allocation of resources among hospital clusters by the Hospital Authority**

At the meeting on 14 January 2008, the Administration was requested to revert to members in six months' time on the motion carried, the development of the new internal funding allocation model, the suggestion of rotating Hospital Chief Executives (HCEs) to also serve as Cluster Chief Executive and the progress made in rotating HCEs to work at other hospitals.

At the request of the Bills Committee on Smoking (Public Health) (Amendment) Bill 2005, the Administration undertook to examine the viability of prohibiting the use of tobacco brand name and logo on non-tobacco products.

At the meeting on 10 December 2007, Dr Hon YEUNG Sum suggested to invite representatives from the two universities with medical faculties to discuss billing arrangements for private patients at a future meeting.

- 10. Mode of supply of self-financed item (SFI) drugs to patients of public hospitals** To be confirmed

At the meeting on 12 February 2007, the Administration was requested to report to the Panel when the HA Board had come to a view on the mode of supply of SFI drugs before implementation.

- 11. Regulation of "Health Maintenance Organisations" (HMOs)** To be confirmed

The issue was last discussed at the meeting on 11 June 2007. The Administration was requested to revert to the Panel the timeframe for establishing a statutory licensing regime to regulate HMOs, in view of the lack of adequacy of the Medical Director concept to safeguard patients' welfare.
